I thought they did very well! Next, Chelsea Lacroix (a grade 3 student) read the poem, "In Flanders Fields". Captain Esselaar (the husband of Mrs. Esselaar, a teacher at our school) took a few moments to share with us a little history about Remembrance Day. His presentation included a slideshow, which we all found very sad. It is hard to understand why men have to fight for peace... When he finished, Arden Strieb (a grade 7 student) read a poem in French. It was nice to have such a mixture of both English and French throughout the assembly! Next, Padre Tyrell, a minister, gave a wonderful speech on the many reasons why we should be thankful to live in such a peaceful country. Then Mr. Eric Smith, a war veteran, told us about

some of his personal experiences as a pilot in both the Second World War and the Korean War. Lots of people were interested! After he finished speaking, student representatives from each class placed wreaths that they had all made together at the front. Finally, Ben Deal, a grade 7 student, played "Last Post" on the trumpet. There were 2 minutes of silence, and then he played "Reveille". Many were impressed. The assembly finished, and Mrs. Haworth dismissed the audience, and all of the guests, teachers and students left the gymnasium in silence.

While Chris is at work at the Children's Treatment Centre next to CHEO, Hal is a busy little beaver in our community. He is just a fellow who can't say no when asked to help out in the village. In 1996 he got involved with the newly formed Navan Community Association and was its President for 6 years - 2000 to 2006. Then in 1999, he joined the Navan Lions Club, and in 2003 became President of this Club for the next 3 years. There sure were some hectic times when the Presidencies of both organisations overlapped!! He believes firmly in the Vision Programs for Lions International and especially the screenings, the Lions do at the local schools. They always find students who need to see an optometrist. In fact about 22% of them have been tagged as needing glasses and several others have been diagnosed with a more serious eye disease. He enjoys the Lions BBQs that raise money for area schools. The last year he was President, the Club's membership increased by 7 members. He credits Marg MacNeill as the Club Membership Chairperson and the other members for helping this along. On October 27, 2007 at the 55th anniversary celebrations of the Navan Lions Club, Hal was the recipient of a Melvin Jones Fellowship award. This award recognizes a member's involvement in humanitarian work, both in his community and internationally through Lionism. It is a great honour to receive this and the club donates \$1000.00 on his behalf to Sight First II, the Lions' International vision programme. Congratulations Hal!

Hal keeps a file of pictures of the community events, which is available on line. If you stop in at The Resonance Café you can see these on the computer there and probably meet this gregarious man. Most of his adult life has seen Hal volunteering no matter where he lives. As a member of the Federation of Ontario Naturalists he has taken many people on hikes in the parks and different regions of Ontario. He's thinking of doing hikes in and about Navan in the coming year. His specialty is birds, although he can cover almost everything in the natural history vein. Now he is looking for help to finish the trail in the wooded areas paralleling the old CPR tracks. He was instrumental in getting the curbs repaved along Trim Road to allow for bicycles and with Marg MacNeill developed the "Rural Pathways" Plan for the village and surrounding area.

He was soccer coach at Cairine Wilson High School for a year when one of his sons attended. He is also in charge of the Remembrance Day programme at the cenotaph here in Navan, this year.

Hal is so busy he finds it difficult to find time for his hobbies, which are photography and being a naturalist.

He and Chris are happy about their move to Navan. They both love the small town atmosphere, and knowing the neighbours next door and down the street. The grand children love to come out to visit and play in the woods behind the house. The Navan Fair is a family event nobody misses!!

HOME TIP OF THE MONTH

A venison recipe at special request:

- 7 lb roast
- 2 tbsp flour
- 1 tsp salt
- ¼ tsp pepper
- 1 medium cooked onion-quartered
- 3 slices of bacon
- 1 can of whole cranberries

Wipe roast well with clean damp cloth. Rub roast with seasoned flour and place on a rack in a roaster. Add cut onion. Place pieces of bacon on top of roast and then top with cranberries. Cover and roast in a 325 F degree oven until desired degree of doneness is reached (25 min. per pound for rare, 30 min for medium and 35 for well done). Serves 8-10. Serve hot. Enjoy.
