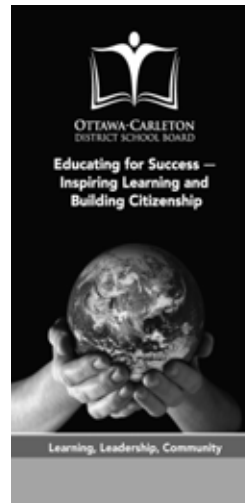

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WINE MAKING

Rules and Regulations:

- One entry per exhibitor in any class
- Exhibitor must be a member of the Society.
- All entries must be produced by exhibitor.
- Entries must be phoned in to 613-833-0004 or e-mailed to debbie.locas@svmpatico.ca on or before Monday, July 27th, 2009 to Kim or Debbie Locas.
- Judging will be held on Thursday, August 2~. 2009
- Entry forms and bottle tags must bear identical information as to entrant, class and ingredients.
- Bottles must be of clear or tinted glass and clean (no labels).
- Wine bottle size will be 750 ml or 500 ml (PET plastic). Liquor or other bottles are not acceptable.
- Closures will be new. Screw-caps or twist — off caps will NOT be accepted except for PET bottles.
- Entry tags are best attached using elastics.
- Judging will be based on the following criteria: Colour, Clarity, Bouquet & Flavour,
- Balance and Quality (and sparkle where appropriate). An entry not entered in the appropriate section will be disqualified.

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- Competitors may enter only one wine in each section and are responsible for selecting the correct class in which to enter.
- The decision of the Judge is final.
- Failure to comply with any one of these rules may result in the disqualification of the entry.

HOME TIP OF THE MONTH

1. Longer-lasting soap – Unwrap bar soap and let it air-dry several days before using it – it'll last longer!
2. Tub trick – After scrubbing them clean, treat the walls of your fiberglass tub or shower enclosure to a thin coat of car wax. The newly slick surface will repel dirt and soap scum and make future clean-ups easier!
3. Window dressing – Spray paint plain curtain rods and finials gold, silver or bronze for a rich and elegant look.
4. Linen saver – Placed a too-hot pot on your tablecloth and now there's a scorch? Rub the cut side of a white onion onto the scorch: soak in sudsy water, and then launder. The mark should lighten up!
5. Instant air freshener! – Simply boil a handful of whole cloves in a small saucepan with 2-3 cups of water, then let simmer. It'll fill your house with a pleasing scent.

Group Homes in Navan

We received a few emails of concerns about the property being renovated on Barnwell which is operated by the Innovative Community Support Services (ICSS) which had a write-up in the April Nugget. Here is their web site www.icss.ca if you would like more information about them and what they do.

Councillor Rob Jellett's office provided the information below about the by-laws.

The definition of a **Group home** means a supervised **residential use building** in which three to ten persons, exclusive of staff, live as a group in a single household living arrangement, and where the residents require support or supervision on a daily basis, but excludes **correctional facilities** and **shelters**.

Section 3 of the Official Plan states: "*Where the zoning by-law permits a dwelling, the by-law will also permit a group home. The zoning by-law may include area-specific provisions to regulate the type, size and location of this use.*" The following link will take you to that section: ottawa.ca/city_hall/ottawa2020/official_plan/vol_1/03_design_land_use/index_en-01

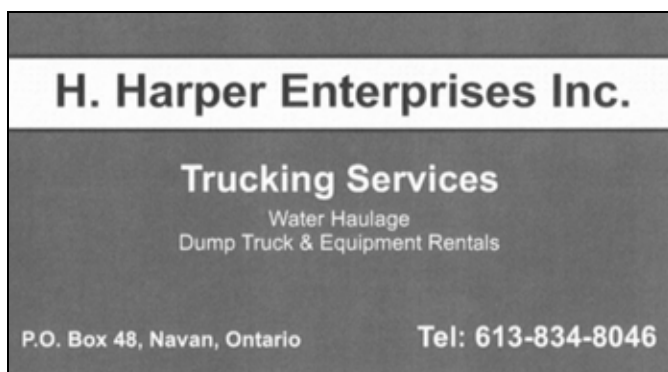
Group Homes are regulated under Section 125 of Part 5. Here's the link:

ottawa.ca/residents/bylaw/a_z/zoning/parts/pt_05/index_en-06. You will note that there is an amending by-law 2008-326. The following is the amendment:

f) Subsection 125(1) and clause 125(1)(a) of the said by-law are amended as follows:

125. (1) Where a group home is a permitted use in a zone, in addition to the provisions of the zone in which it is located, a group home:

(a) when located in a residential zone, must be within a dwelling type permitted in that zone;

NAVAN'S VOLUNTEER FIRE FIGHTERS CORNER



Did you know that you are required to have a permit from the City of Ottawa if you want to have a controlled open air fire? Open air fire also refers to backyard fire pits, fire places and chimneys. There are four types of permits: annual, annual agricultural, annual restricted and specific event. Each permit has specific rules and regulations that the permit holder must follow. Failing to follow these rules and regulations can lead to a visit from the Ottawa Fire Services. You will be asked to extinguish your fire and possible charges under the by-law may be laid by Ottawa Bylaw personnel.

Did you also know that May and June are high- risk months for brush fires? Most brush fires are human- related: carelessness, the size of the burn, the fire getting out of control, burning the wrong materials, or burning on a day that is deemed unsafe. When you follow the proper procedures through the City of Ottawa by calling in for your burn you will be informed as to whether or not there is a Burn Ban on that day. This permit can be purchased from any City of Ottawa Clint Service Center or in our area from Station 73 on Rockdale Road in Vars. The cost of the permit is \$12 and is valid for the calendar year.

Brush Truck 71 is stationed at Station 71 in Navan and is responsible for responding to brush fires in the Eastern District of Ottawa ranging from Orleans to Cumberland, Navan and Vars. In cases of large Brush Fires anywhere in Ottawa, Brush Truck 71 will respond to help. BT71 can also be dispatched for Mutual aid in parts of Russell and Rockland.

Navan's brush truck is designed with a trailer that pulls a 6-wheeled Ranger. This 6- wheeler ATV is used to carry equipment and man power into the fields or in difficult areas that the brush truck cannot enter. The Brush Truck is a Ford F450 that seats 4 Firefighters and carries all tools necessary to fight the brush fires as well as portable gas powered pumps and 1600 feet of forestry hose. In the case of a brush fire, the brush truck is always accompanied by a Tanker which carries 2500 litres of water as well as a Pump apparatus which is used for man power as well as the ability to pump water.

Station 71 asks all residents to please be safe. Keep your open air fires controlled by calling them in, have water readily available and strategically place your open air burns away from dangerous exposures.

A quick note, this year's Emergency and Protective Services Day, at the Cumberland Museum will be held on July 12th. Hope to see everyone there.
