Citizen Judge Brian Coburn and Senior Citizen Judge George Springate officiated and enthusiastically welcomed us in choosing to become citizens of this great nation.

We pledged to be “faithful and bear true allegiance to her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, Queen of Canada; her heirs and successors” which was easy for me as I was a British Subject. Next we said “I will faithfully observe the laws of Canada” which again was a no brainer because our Veterans and Politicians have fought or worked hard to give us laws to make our land envied by many other nations. Finally that we would “fulfill our duties as a Canadian citizen” which is to vote in elections, help others, care and protect our heritage and environments, express our opinions freely and eliminate discrimination and injustice.

I was asked many times why it took me so long to become a Canadian Citizen, until that night I did not have an answer. But listening to the inspiring words of Judge Brian Coburn I had my answer. Thirdly a few months back while attending a Lions event, where we had to sing “God Save the Queen” and I could not remember the words but knew all the words for “O Canada”. Finally Judge Brian stressed that it was important for us new Canadians to give back to our country and make a difference in people’s lives. Therefore having been a recipient of some awards for volunteering I feel that could make a difference in my next 50 years as a proud Canadian.

I would like to thank the Navan, Cumberland and Orleans Lions members, Navan Fair board members, Bell co-workers, family and community members who took time out of their busy schedules to come and share this very special evening with me and my 50 fellow new Canadians.

In the Fall of 2007, he began the work of pouring the base - 18 feet in diameter. One side of it is 1 foot while the other is 3 feet. It took a year to get it fully functional. Water is recycled as it goes through 4000 gallons of water an hour. He’s placed 5 subtle soft lights that shimmer in the evenings. Take a walk in Clarke Woods 2 some lovely evening and bask in the beauty of this lovely fount!

As we chatted Joe reminisced and remarked that his friend, the late Keith Simpson, had put in the piping for the electrical for the fountain. Keith would have loved to see it in full bloom. He would be so happy for, and proud of his friend, Joe.

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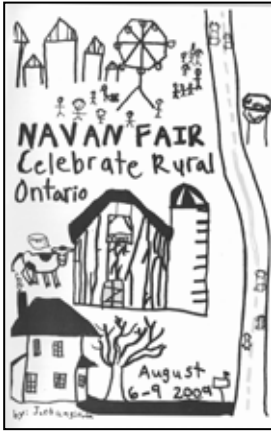
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YOUTH IN ACTION

COMMUNITY BBQ June 13th

The Navan Community Association welcomes everyone to a **FREE BBQ** on Saturday June 13th, between 11:00 and 2:00 under the domes at the Fair Grounds. Rain or shine, come meet and eat



Please be aware that a small reddish-brown fox has been spotted along Mustang and Meteor Street area almost every morning between 9 and 10 am. The Ministry of Natural Resources has been contacted and has given the following tips on how to avoid attracting wild animals such as fox and to ensure the safety of the neighborhood.

Tip 1- Make sure to keep your yard clean of any potential food sources such as:

- I. removing bird baths and bird feeders (as they attract not only birds but small rodents and bugs that can become a smorgasbord for the fox)
- II. any wood or branch piles should be removed as they can house rodents
- III. garbage should be kept in an enclosed area or put in garbage cans

Tip 2- If you see the fox in your yard, you should make loud noises with pots and pans and a wooden spoon as well as the sound of your voice to scare it away and to educate the fox that it is not welcome in your yard and should return to the woods.

Tip 3- Although very rarely will a fox attack family pets, you should keep a close watch on your small dogs and cats.

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OTTAWA PUBLIC HEALTH has received laboratory confirmations of additional cases of novel H1N1 Influenza A (human swine flu) bringing our total number of confirmed cases to 6 as of May 12, 2009. The case is consistent with the profile of most cases in Ontario. We anticipate that additional cases of novel H1N1 Influenza A virus will be confirmed in the city; accordingly we will update ottawa.ca/health with current information. Our public health recommendations remain unchanged.

Individuals who are well are encouraged to go about their business as usual while adopting the simple prevention measures listed below. This applies to returning travellers who have no symptoms, as well as individuals who have been in contact with confirmed cases or returning travellers. Developing a vaccine specific to the H1N1 flu virus has been identified as a priority internationally.

Individuals who have flu-like symptoms – a fever over 38 C/100.4 F, a cough that is getting worse, severe headache and/or fatigue are advised to

- Stay home from work, school or public gatherings for seven days (from when the symptoms started) or at least 24 hours after symptoms have resolved, whichever is longer
- See your health care provider if you have concerns or if you are experiencing severe symptoms
- Limit contact with household members and wash hands frequently
- Use self-care measures such as increasing your fluid intake, getting adequate rest and treating yourself for your symptoms. Avoidance of tobacco smoke and cool compresses may be helpful.

We remind residents of several simple measures that can minimize the risk of being infected. These steps include:

- washing your hands well and frequently
- coughing and sneezing into your sleeve instead of your hands
- staying home when you are sick

Ottawa Public Health continues its enhanced surveillance measures and communication with all our partners to protect the health and well-being of all residents and

visitors to Ottawa. We will continue to keep you apprised of the situation in Ottawa should it escalate further.



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"Put Your Mind to It: Make Change Happen in the Fight Against Alzheimer's Disease"

Elizabeth Manley-Theobald and Dr. Andrew Frank are the special presentation speakers at the Alzheimer Society of Ottawa and Renfrew County's Annual General Meeting on Wednesday, June 3, 2009 from 8:30 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. at Tudor Hall at 3750 North Bowesville Road, Ottawa (near Riverside & Uplands). Following the Alzheimer Society's short business meeting, Ms. Manley-Theobald, Figure Skating Coach and 1988 Olympic Silver Medalist, will speak on "Breaking Down the Stigma with My Family's Story" about her father's journey with Alzheimer's disease. Dr. Frank, Cognitive and Behavioural Neurologist, as well as the Medical Director of the Memory Disorder Clinic, will focus on the "Current Research into the Cause and Treatment of Alzheimer's Disease". Registration cost is \$25. The Alzheimer Society's special presentation during its AGM will be of interest to both family members, healthcare professionals, those supporting individuals and families coping with dementia, and the general public. We all have a reason to care. In Ottawa and Renfrew County, 12,000 people have Alzheimer's disease and related dementias and this number does not include family members. For every person affected, 10 to 12 others are directly impacted.

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ARE YOU READY?

In our everyday lives, large-scale emergencies and disasters seem like a remote possibility. However natural disasters such as floods, tornadoes, technological or environmental accidents such as chemical spills, service disruptions such as power failures can happen anywhere at any time. The City of Ottawa is prepared. You need to be ready to take care of yourself and those around you. Each household is being asked to be self sufficient for the first 72 hours of a major emergency. Readiness can be as simple as having a supply of water, food, emergency items, and making sure you and your family knows how to respond. Knowing what to do when a disaster strikes will help you better control the situation and be in a better position to recover quickly. The City of Ottawa has created the Are You Ready program to assist the public in being prepared for emergencies. Steps in the Are You Ready?

program include creating an emergency communications plan, establishing a family meeting place, assembling a emergency preparedness kit, learning about community emergency plans and the emergency plans of your children's schools. Also it is beneficial to learn basic first aid techniques. Emergency preparedness kits contain non-perishable food, a first aid kit, flashlight, candles, etc. Emergency preparedness kits should be kept in an easily accessible place in case you need to evacuate your home quickly. A full list of items and other details on the steps to emergency preparedness can be found at www.ottawa.ca The City of Ottawa's Office of Emergency Management has a network of community trainers that deliver Are You Ready? presentations to the public.
