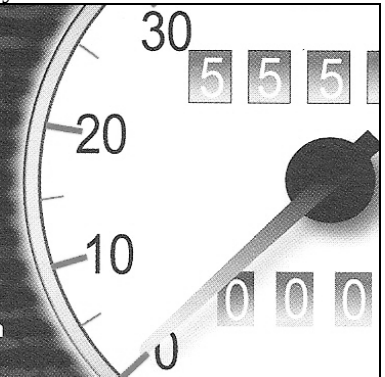

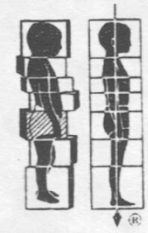
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HOME TIP OF THE MONTH

Smart ways to use Hydrogen peroxide

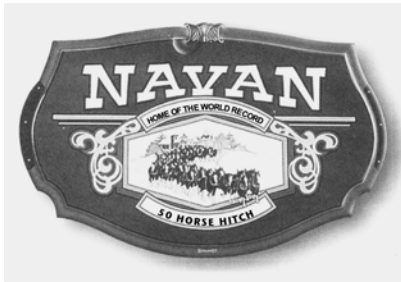
- Better bouquets! Add a spoonful of hydrogen peroxide to the water in your use to help fresh flowers stay pretty longer!

- Laundry solution! Out of bleach? Use an equal amount of hydrogen peroxide instead!



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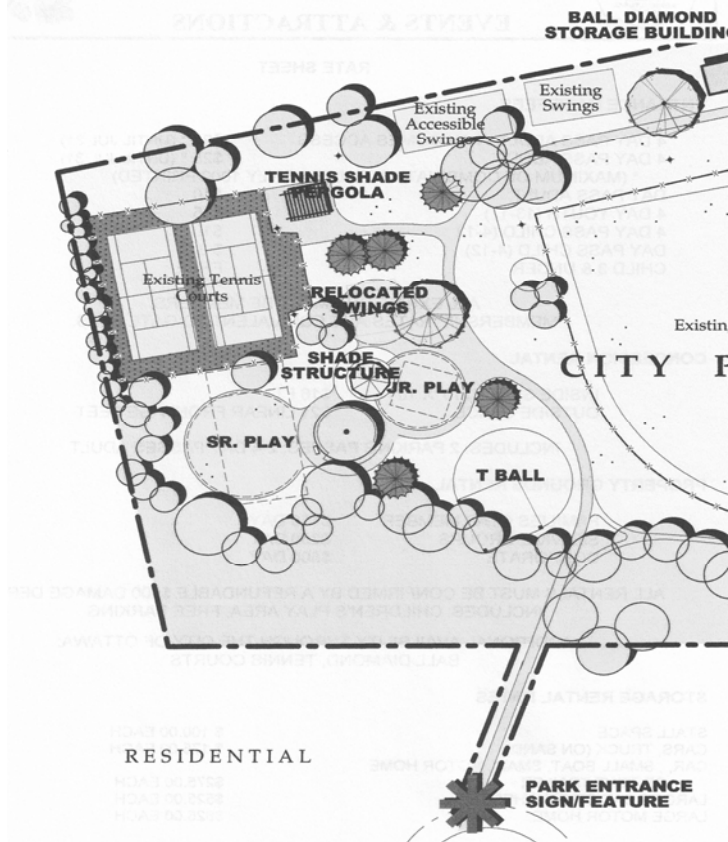

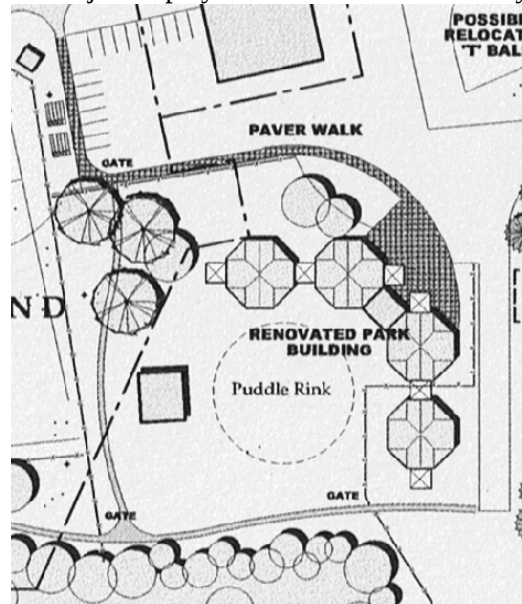
COMMUNITY PARK PROJECT UPDATE

For years now, the Navan Community Association (NCA) has been looking for ways to embellish our community's park. When it was announced that the City would be replacing the senior play structure (as previously mentioned in the Nugget), a Park Plan Committee, consisting of members of the NCA, the City and the Fair Board, was formed to develop a plan which could be launched in conjunction with the City's work.

The Park Plan Committee is now excited to announce that the plan they have developed was accepted by the Fair Board and the NCA at their respective June meetings. The work will be starting this fall in order to "piggy-back" on the City's replacement of the senior play structure. The plan will consist of relocating the T-ball field, junior play area and junior swings in order for them to be closer to the senior play



This was a popular request among Navan residents. These changes will also allow for the addition of a shade structure adjacent to the play areas (to be added at a later date) and for a shade/storage structure for the tennis players. We are hopeful that the City will have it in their budget to replace the junior play structure in the next few years.



At the domes, a basketball court and a puddle rink will be added.

Of course, these plans can only be fully accomplished with the community's support. The NCA members will be planning activities and events over the next few months to raise the funds required to complete the Park Plan Committee's plan.

The City of Ottawa is seeking members of the community with the required skills and knowledge to act as valuers of damage to livestock and poultry, as prescribed by the *Livestock, Poultry and Honey Bee Protection Act*. Valuers must be able to adhere to strict deadlines, have good organizational and accurate reporting skills, and be willing to complete or have completed the required training provided by the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs. Valuers must be familiar with farming, livestock production and wildlife management issues. Experience with claim management and program administration is beneficial. Residence in or near Rideau-Goulbourn Ward or Cumberland Ward is preferred. Use of a reliable vehicle and a valid driver's license are also required. Remuneration will be on a per call basis. ATV RIDING IS NOT CHILD'S PLAY

In many cases where children have been injured or killed in an ATV incident, the parents were unaware that ATVs:

- *Roll over easily.* ATVs have a high centre of gravity, make them more likely to roll over and land on the rider.
- *Are not meant for passengers.* Most ATVs are built for one person. Passengers can affect the stability and control of the ATV, causing them to tip more easily.
- *Can weigh up to 800 lbs.* Adult sized machines pose a high risk to children under 16 due to the drastic differences in weight between the child and the machine.
- *Are responsible for multiple childhood injuries and deaths* *. In 2005/2006 the Eastern Ontario region had about 1,000 emergency department visits and 90 hospitalizations for all ages. Twenty-three percent of emergency department visits and 14 percent of hospitalizations were for children under 16 years.

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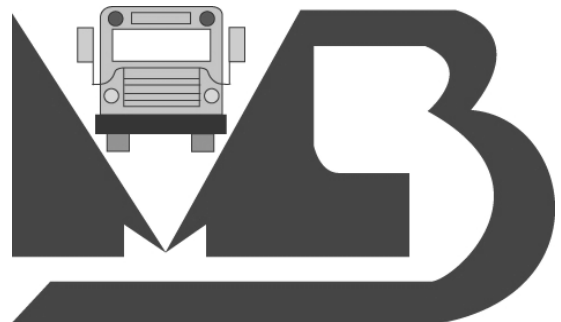
