The Cumberland Township Agricultural Society would like to advise you in advance of planned street closures during some of the 2009 Navan Fair activities.

On Saturday, August 8th the traditional Fair Parade will take place. Participants will congregate in the field off Smith Road just south of Meteor Street. The Parade commences approximately at 11:00 am which will proceed along Smith Road east to Colonial, crossing over Trim and continuing east on Colonial until Delson. The Police and volunteers will be directing motorist and spectators as the Parade proceeds along its route.

On Sunday, August 9th the Board will be introducing the Navan Fair Bed Race which will leave from the Royal Bank Parking lot (3435 Trim) south to the corner of Smith and Colonial Roads, turning left on to Colonial to J.T. Bradley's Country Convenience store parking lot (1220 Colonial Road) The Bed Race will commence at 11:30 am run until 1:00 pm, therefore traffic will be redirected off Trim Road at Henn and on to Colonial Road for east. Funds raised will be donated to Ovarian and Breast Cancer.

Navan Fair Talent Showcase

For the second year in a row, the **Navan Fair** has been awarded a grant by the Department of Canadian Heritage through its *Building Communities Through Arts and Heritage Program (BCAH)*. The BCAH Program aims to increase opportunities for local artists and artisans to be involved in their community, through festivals or other events and activities.

Money received from the BCAH Program will be used, in part, to fund the Navan Fair Talent Showcase, where local vocalists will entertain the crowd from the Navan Fair's main stage under the Domes. A total of 25 vocalists will be performing in this year's show. Participants will be accompanied by a live band, led by local musician, Hugues Drouin, and the event will be hosted by local entertainer, Eric Leclerc.

The Navan Fair Talent Showcase will be held at the Navan Fair on Sunday, August 9th, from noon until 3:00pm, at the Domes area of the Navan Fair grounds.

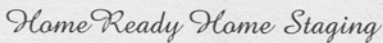

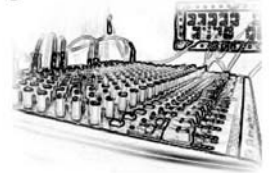

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NAVAN'S VOLUNTEER FIRE FIGHTERS CORNER

The past few days have been busy for station 71. Many of our firefighters took part as one of the many teams registered in the 12 hour RELAY FOR LIFE hosted at Millennium Park. One of our dedicated firefighters, Brett Smith and team leader of Navan's Firefighters helped raise more than \$3000.00 for cancer research. Some of the great qualities that inspire me about the Volunteer Firefighters,

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are their unselfishness and desire to help others, regardless of the task at hand.

Three hours later these same men and women, who had just ran for 12 hours, helped set up the Heritage School Fun Fair. Water activities, fire safety and special guest Sparky, made this a fun event for the entire family. Teaching young children about fire safety and instructing parents on the importance of a fire plan and working smoke alarms is especially gratifying when you consider the importance of our community's safety. Special thanks goes to Lt. Jeff Cotton, Lt. Matt Hill, FF Anthony Vanmunsteren, FF Christian Geoffroy, FF Sylvain Patenaude, FF Colin Lawlor, FF Jeff Edwards, FF Glen Scott, FF Morgan Rigby, FF Mathew Nooyen, FF Peter Tadiello, and our friend Captain Lyle Kinsella from Vars for helping set up this community event.



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How would you feel if it was announced in your workplace that only one person out of three would be covered by Workplace Safety & Insurance Board for certain types of injuries and disease, but you would still be required to perform the same job? In most workplaces it would never be tolerated, but for over 19,000 people in Ontario this is a fact.

In May 2007 the McGuinty government announced an amendment to the *Workplace Safety & Insurance Act* to cover firefighters for certain "fire related" illnesses. These include eight types of cancers and work-related heart injuries that occur within 24 hours of the firefighter being at a fire. Within days the amendment was unanimously passed into law and coverage was extended to the over 10,000 "professional" or full time firefighters across Ontario. At that time, there was also a provision to extend this coverage to fire investigators, forest firefighters, part time firefighters and volunteer firefighters, but to date nothing has happened.

In truth, volunteer firefighters, such as we have in rural Ottawa outnumber full-time firefighters in Ontario almost two to one. According to the most recent statistics from the Fire Marshal's Office there are 19,028 volunteer firefighters, as compared to 10,823 full-time firefighters. However, the government only feels that a minority of people taking on this responsibility deserve to receive extended coverage for the financial protection of their families.

In May of 2007, with cameras rolling and the attention of the press, Premier Dalton McGuinty made the following statement when introducing the amendment to the *Workplace Safety & Insurance Act* affecting firefighters: "The sacrifices made by these heroes every day inspire us to do all we can to keep them safe. It's our job to make sure that firefighters and their families are taken care of when the job is done."

Unfortunately for Linda MacDonald this commitment remains unfulfilled. Her husband Lieutenant Alex MacDonald, an Ottawa volunteer firefighter who served for over 25 years at the Carp station, lost his battle with cancer in what would have been an open and shut case for compensation if Alex had been a fulltime firefighter. But because he was a volunteer firefighter, no compensation has been forthcoming. The families' claim with WSIB has been rejected because the current laws are discriminative towards Lieutenant MacDonald and does not recognise his death as work related.

For volunteer firefighters this situation is deeply insulting. A vast majority of people who join a volunteer fire department do so because they want to give back to their community. It is not a career move and it is definitely not for financial gain, but a certain level of protection must be provided considering the risks involved.

Unfortunately for people like Linda Macdonald all they can do is wait. She will be forced to appeal the claim before September of this year and if the long overdue

legislation is not changed her chance of success is questionable. How much longer should she have to wait when for the past 25 years she waited patiently while her husband and the father of her children served his community with pride and dedication? Over two years has passed since the coverage was provided for full-time firefighters and to date there has been little progress in spite of the numerous council resolutions that Ontario municipalities have passed in support of their valued volunteer firefighters.

Volunteer firefighters don't have a union to lobby politicians for their cause. However, they do have communities that support the efforts and commitment of the people that take on this responsibility. Many local politicians like to stand next to firefighters for photo opportunities and now is the time they need to stand up for them as well. Now is the time to let your local MPP know that this situation has gone on long enough. It is time to enact legislation to provide the same coverage to the volunteer firefighters who are doing the same job as their fulltime counterparts.

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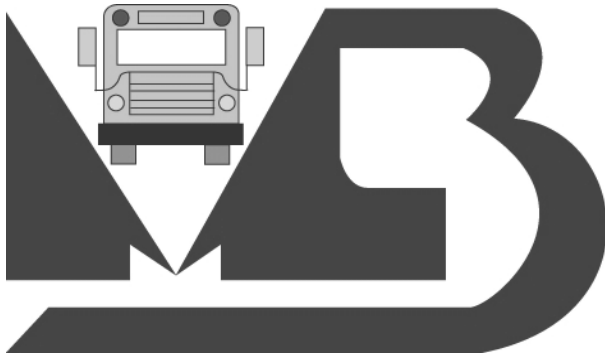
