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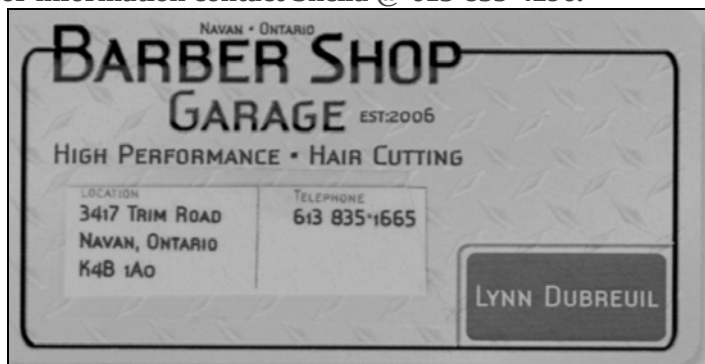
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NAVAN @ 150 YEARS OLD - ALIVE AND WELL AND LIVING IN OTTAWA

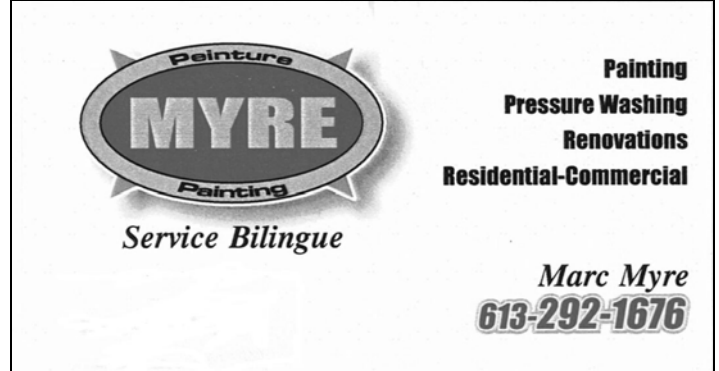
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NOTABLES (complements of the Navan Women's Institute)

EDUCATION

The intention of our division is to encourage children to participate in the Navan Fair and make them aware of the agricultural community. We hope that those who take part in this section will first and foremost have fun! So gather pencils, paints, pens, crayons, scissors and your imagination. We can hardly wait to see what you create!

Education Rules and Regulations

- Exhibitors must enter in the grade they just completed as of June 2010
- No identification marks on the front of the entries
- Only one entry piece per item in each grade category
- Entries should be emailed (trishbogaert@rogers.com) by Tuesday, August 10 so that tags may be made in advance. Please provide the first and last name of the child, the grade and category(s) they are entering.
- Due to space limitations, items should not be any bigger than 8.5" x 11" unless otherwise stated.
- All paintings, drawings, etc. should be mounted on a solid coloured piece or construction paper with a border of at least 1 cm showing.
- Judging will be based on A) Overall appeal; B) Creativity (original work); C) Effective use of colour, space and materials; D) Neatness and organization
- All entries must be the work of the exhibitor. Projects completed during the 2009-10 school year are eligible.
- Exhibits are to be brought to the Exhibit Building (Blue Building) on Wednesday, August 11, 2010 between 6:00 pm and 8:00 pm.
- Judging will take place on Thursday, August 12, 2010. The building will be closed to the public until approximately 4:00 pm. This is to allow the judging to be completed. The building will open after the judging.
- Exhibits must be left on display until Sunday, August 15th, 2010 and can be picked up after 4:00 pm. The Board is not responsible for items or prized unclaimed after 6:00 pm on Sunday evening.

- Prize money will be ready for pick up at the Fair Office any time after Noon on Friday, August 13th, 2010.
- Any prizes not claimed by the end of September, 2010 will be considered a donation to the Cumberland Township Agricultural Society.

Note to Parents and Entrants

Due to the nature of this division, entries not phoned or emailed ahead will not be refused; however, every effort should be made to register your entries by phone or e-mail before Tuesday, August 10, 2010...

Pre-School

1. Draw a picture of something you would see at the fair. Picture should have a title or label indicating the child's description of his or her picture.
2. Decorate a rock.
3. Colour a picture from a colouring book.
Junior Kindergarten
4. Print your first name with markers and draw a picture of yourself.
5. Paint a picture of your family.
6. Glue five objects onto a base and write numbers (1-5).

Senior Kindergarten

7. Paint a picture of yourself (full body).
8. Print the alphabet using markers.
9. Glue ten objects onto a base and write the numbers (1-10).

Prize money is not given out to the Pre-School, Junior or Senior Kindergarten, but there will be something for the children (or parent) to pick up when the entry is brought to the Blue Building.

Grades One & Two

10. Printing sample – O Canada (in English or French – 1st verse).
11. Make a puppet from a paper bag.
12. Make a poster showing how to take care of a pet.
13. Survey your friends to find out what their favourite ride is at the fair. Make a graph or chart of your findings.
14. Draw and label your favourite animal.

Grades Three & Four

15. Make a diorama (3D display) of your favourite sports and/or hobbies. (No Kits, please)
16. Using pencil crayons, draw yourself and your family doing a favourite activity (Give the picture a title).
17. Cursive writing sample (O'Canada – 1st verse).
18. Create a personal pizza with your favourite toppings (any medium).
19. Make a model of a castle (not to exceed 50 cm in height or width).

Grades Five & Six

20. Design (draw) and label a new idea for a ride at the fair.
21. Make one picture showing tessellations.

22. Draw and label a bird's eye (aerial) view of the fair.
 23. Dress up a stuffed toy for "A Day at the Navan Fair".
 24. Make (and decorate) a paper airplane.

Grades Seven & Eight

25. Draw your ideal bedroom.
 26. Using any medium (fabric, foam, felt, etc.) design a pennant or small flag promoting the Navan Fair.
 27. Make a cartoon strip (minimum three illustrations).
 28. Build and decorate a sturdy model of a structure (bridge, tower, house, etc). Must not exceed 50 cm in height or width. (No kits, please)
 29. Make a pointillism (dots) self-portrait using any medium (pencils, markers, etc).

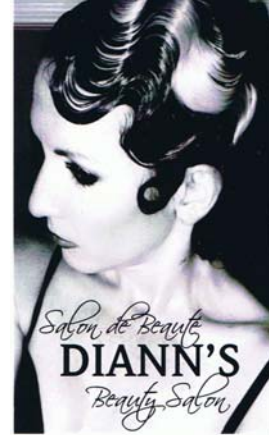

ONTARIO RURAL SUMMER JOBS SERVICE

Ontario Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs (OMAFRA)

The 2010 Ontario Rural Summer Jobs Service is now accepting applications from employers who plan to create summer jobs for rural youth. Businesses and

community organizations in rural Ontario, including rural Ottawa, can receive a hiring incentive of \$2 per hour to create student employment. Employers can benefit from the program for up to 16 weeks. To qualify, the student employment must be created sometime during the six-month period from April 1st to September 30th. The goal of the Rural Summer Jobs Service is to help create jobs that enhance the skills and work experience of students in rural Ontario. The program provides financial assistance to employers who can create jobs for students between the ages of 14 and 30, who intend to return to school in the fall of 2010. In 1996 when we started the Community Association, we were told by many residents that they will only be involved and attend meetings when there are issues that concern them otherwise we could proceed and do what we thought best for the community. Below are some of the accomplishments that about 30 dedicated members have accomplished on your behalf. We hope you are pleased.



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NCA ACCOMPLISHMENTS to date

1. Created strong links with the Municipal Government, since creation in 1996.
2. Liaise with the city on rural concerns, zoning, planning, road maintenance, sidewalks, signage, street lighting, police/fire/ emergency services, etc.,
3. Established, and co-ordinate the monthly Youth Dances, utilizing dedicated adults and youth monitors since 1999.
4. Support the Outdoor rink, operate and maintain Tennis Courts, provide an umbrella for the operation of minor baseball.
5. Planning, building and maintenance of the Walking & Nature Trails,
6. Hold public & monthly meetings, produce & distribute Bulletins & Newsletter to keep the community up to date on issues and events,
7. Instrumental in bringing OC Transpo Express Bus Service as a quick, friendly, economical, and fun way to get to work downtown,
8. Lead the Beautification of the village project by coordinating the disbursement of a \$100,000 grant from the City for new town entrance signs, flower beds, the Horses status, Sidewalks at Colonial and Trim, etc.,
9. Partnered with Navan Lions & Womens Institute to build access ramps for the Post Office,
10. Coordinated the procurement and planting of numerous trees along the walking trail and throughout the village,
11. Purchase, plant, weed, and water the town flower beds,
12. Leadership role in organizing, and co-ordinating

community events such as *Water Sampling, Annual Town Garage Sale, Annual BBQ*, etc.,

13. Co-ordinate actions regarding resident's concerns on environmental issues, including *factory farming, surface & ground water quality*, etc.,
14. Sponsored Cumberland Ward 19, *Builder's Award for Heritage*, and the Orleans Youth Awards.
15. Instrumental in the creation of a Master plan for improvement of Centennial Park with initial phase starting this spring.
16. Spearheading the restoration and relocation of the Navan Cenotaph
17. Active representation on Public Advisory Committee (PAC) such as the NCC 60 year plan, the Petrie Island activity, and so on,
18. Actively working with the City and other interested groups to be involved with the upgrading of park for the enjoyment and safety of residents,
19. Provide an outlet for residents to communicate safety concerns and have them followed up by NCA volunteers.



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NAVAN CENTENNIAL PARK EMBELLISHMENT PROJECT

As stated in previous issues of the Nugget, the Park Plan Committee, operating under the Navan Community Association, has been cooperating with the City of Ottawa since January 2009, to improve and embellish Navan's park. We are excited to see our project move forward successfully and we are anxious to see the results of the hard work of many volunteers. The construction for Phase 1 of this embellishment project is expected to start sometime in May and should last 6-8 weeks. Areas of the park will therefore be closed for most of May and June, and access to the tennis courts might be interrupted for a short period. Access should be maintained to the large baseball diamond. We apologize for any inconvenience this ground work will cause, but we believe Navan residents will be proud of their new park once it reopens, hopefully no later than July. The Park Plan Committee would like to thank Linda Payant and the office of Rob Jellett for being instrumental in the realization of this project. 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HOME TIPS OF THE MONTH

Baking Soda

- Baking soda on a damp sponge removes grease easily from stove, back splash etc.
- Great for carpet deodorising, just sprinkle onto carpet before going to bed and vacuum in the morning.
- Baking Soda is better than any cleaner for cleaning baths and sinks.
- Baking Soda can be used for laundry - leaves everything smelling nice and cleans.
- Keeping pipes clean under the sink - pour about one quarter cup of baking soda down the drain with about 1 cup of vinegar, this makes a chemical reaction, then pour some hot water down the drain. Hey Presto!
- Baking soda is also good for getting rid of unwanted insects, just sprinkle around cabinets and cupboards and other places the insects might run.
- If you burn a saucepan put in some baking soda and while it is still hot and allow to soak.
- To minimise odours in your fridge, remove top from box of baking soda and place it on one of the shelves. From time to time stir contents.

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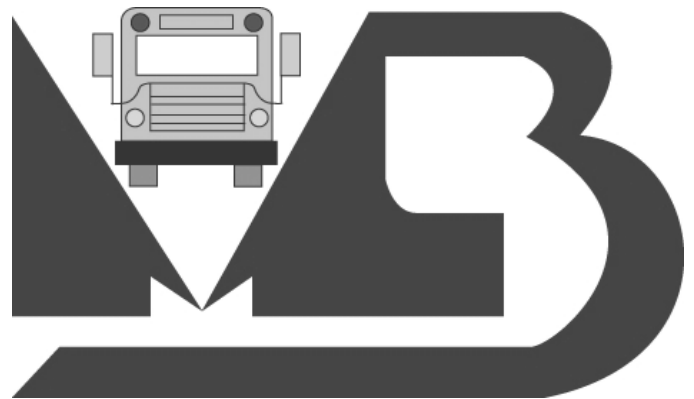

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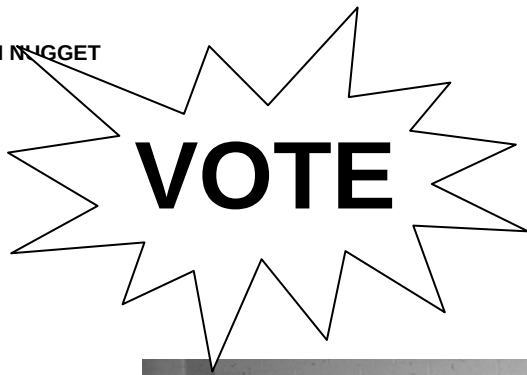
