We have to be very proud of our youth generating this type of success year after year. Cairine Wilson Secondary School joins the fight against cancer by hosting their 7th annual Relay for life event for their school and the community of Orleans and Navan. The 12 hour Relay for Life will be held at the Navan Fairground in Navan on Friday, May 14th, 2010. The Opening Ceremony will begin at 12 noon with Rod MacNeil piping the Survivors to the stage. The Opening Ceremony will then continue with some inspirational speeches and wonderful songs and a special presentation from Ion Aimers who will present 10 free meals at the Works for the team who raises the most money. The Survivors will then be piped around the track for the first lap and the students, staff, parents, family and friends will join in. Watching the Survivors go around the track is a truly inspiring part of this event. Later on at dusk, there will be a Luminary Ceremony, with more speeches and songs and then hundreds of luminary bags with handwritten messages to loved ones will be lit. A HOPE sign made from the luminary bags will also be lit. It is a truly touching and memorable night for students, staff, parents and families. There will be around 300 participating again this year. From 2004 to 2009 we have raised \$175,000. Our goal is to make it \$200,000. Our mission is to help eradicate cancer and improve the quality of life of people living with cancer. Cairine Wilson staff and students can do this with your help. We welcome the community to come and drop by on May 14th.

A luminary is a special way to pay tribute to friends and loved ones who have faced cancer. Luminaries are candles lit in a moving sunset ceremony in memory of those lost to cancer or in honour of those who have survived. Bearing the names of those touched by cancer, the special bags light the perimeter of the *Relay* track, lighting the way and giving powerful inspiration to team members as they participate.

YOU CAN purchase a luminary for \$5.00 each during the day and evening of May 12 at the CTAS – Navan Fair office from Marg MacNeill and you can put a special message on the bag.

We are off to a great start with our Cairine Wilson COW PLOP BINGO organized by Travis Ferguson

and Keith Burns. We raised a total of \$256.42 for our Relay for Cancer. We must thoroughly thank Mr. McWilliams and Mr. Denis for bringing the lovely cow to make our event possible. We totally appreciate them taking their time and offering to do this for free.

NAVAN CURLING CLUB



Our Club is 25 years old this year! In 1984 some 50 or so people got together to start a Curling Club. At first they curled out of the Ottawa Curling Club and later out of the R.A. Center. In 1990 funds were amassed to build our very own Curling Club. With land from the Cumberland Township Agricultural Society the Curling Executive planned this 4 ice sheet curling club. It was not an easy task. But members such as Ross Bradley, Lorne Bradley, Gordie Both, Luc Landriault, Norm Clement, Jerry Calver, Yvan Dubeau, Marg Lichti, Blair and Anne Marie Savage, John MacDonald, Denise Reeves and so many more took up the challenge to plan and fundraise to get enough money to build the Club. The Lions were instrumental in supporting the idea of the Curling

Club. Initially they donated \$50,000.00 to the building fund. Thank you for supporting us in this endeavour for Navan. We had great times at dances and dinners, all organized to raise the capital needed to build. Just when they thought they had enough to go ahead, it wasn't. However, over \$150,000.00 was donated to the Club, by dedicated and enthusiastic supporters of the N.C.C. Each donor gave \$2000.00 or \$4000.00 at the time. They eventually got their interest free loans back but because of their generosity the Club was able to be built.. There is a plaque at the entrance thanking these wonderful founding members.

Now, 25 years later, we have over 500 members including the kids curling on Sunday afternoons. An addition has been added to enhance the size of the lounge area. We rent out the lounge and the ice sheets when available. Many Bonspiels and meetings are held here. It is a welcoming, friendly place. The Navan Lions Club have their Lions' Den in the basement. We are a dynamic group of curlers. As the years go by we are becoming tough competition to other clubs. Many participate in Bonspiels throughout the city and provincially. We are even bringing some hardware home! And no matter which Club we play in, Navan is always thought of as a great place to curl in. Many say we have the best ice in town. I tend to agree.

If you ever want to learn this sport come in and visit. We would be only too happy to help you get started!! Hopefully we will see you in September at the start of our 26th season!

TALENT SHOWCASE OPPORTUNITY

For the third year in a row, the Navan Fair has been awarded a grant by the Department of Canadian Heritage through its Building Communities through Arts and Heritage Program (BCAH). The BCAH Program aims to increase opportunities for local artists and artisans to be involved in their community, through festivals or other events and activities.

Money received from the BCAH Program will be used, in part, to fund the Navan Fair Talent Showcase, where local vocalists will entertain the crowd from the Navan Fair's main stage under the Domes. Approximately 25 vocalists will be performing in this year's show.

Participants will be accompanied by a live band, led by local musician, Hugues Drouin, and the event will be hosted by local entertainer, Eric Leclerc.

The Navan Fair Talent Showcase will be held at the Navan Fair on Sunday, August 15th, from noon until 3:00pm, at the Domes area of the Navan Fair grounds.

- Bottles must be of clear or tinted glass and clean (no labels).

- Failure to comply with any one of these rules may result in the disqualification of the entry.

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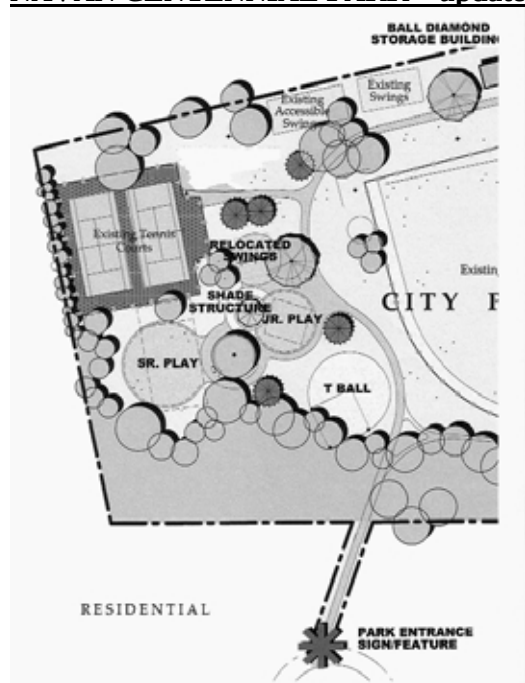

NAVAN CENTENNIAL PARK – update

We are excited to confirm that the construction for the renewal and embellishment of the park will start in early May. New play structures for both age groups will be installed and, as you can see on the park design attached at the end of this newsletter, the junior play area and swings will be relocated closer to the senior play area. The t-ball field and pathways will also be redone and a concrete platform will be put in place in preparation for a shade structure to be installed at a later date. The construction requires access from the north and the south, therefore construction vehicles will be accessing the park through the parking lot adjacent to the Curling Club as well as the pedestrian path off Wickham Court. The work is expected to take 6-8 weeks. While public access will be maintained to the large baseball diamond and the tennis courts, the rest of the park will be closed during this time, until the work is accepted by the City as being complete. ROAD CONSTRUCTION AND CLOSURES EXPECTED

Mer Bleue Widening (\$5 Million – Infrastructure Stimulus Project) Widening works will continue this year, south of Innes to the Hydro Corridor. The lanes will be widened from 2 lanes to 4 lanes.

Trim Road (\$10 Million) – Road construction will begin with year, south of Innes to the Blackburn By-Pass. The road will be widened from 2 lanes to 4 lanes. Two roundabouts will also be constructed at Millennium and the Blackburn By-Pass intersections; this will allow easier access and traffic movement.

Tenth Line Road (\$3 Million) – Widening work will be underway, south of Lakepointe to Blackburn By-Pass. Works are expected to commence in May and will be completed in 2011.

Portobello Boulevard (\$3 Million) – construction is currently underway from south of Innes to the Blackburn By-Pass. The road will be widened from 2 lanes to 4 lanes and completion is expected by September 2010.

Blackburn By-Pass (City Portion \$2.5 Million) – The portion from Portobello to Trim Road will be constructed this year. The City and the developers will share the expense.

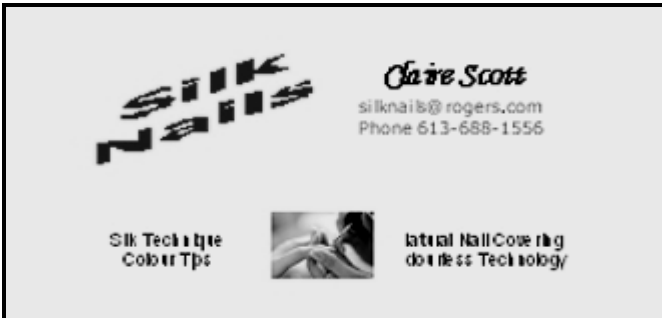

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HOME TIP OF THE MONTH

Cleaning with Lemon

- **Smell** - The citrus smell of a lemon is refreshing and invigorating. For many people a lemon smell has come to symbolize cleanliness. Most major cleaners on the market today have a lemon or a citrus scented version for consumers to enjoy.
- **Acid** - Lemons are acidic and can provide some antibacterial and antiseptic properties for cleaning.

How To Clean With Lemons

Copper - Clean copper-bottomed pots and pans with lemon juice. Copper fixtures can also benefit

from a lemon juice cleaning. Cut a lemon in half. Dip it in some salt, and clean spots from your copper.

Add To Vinegar - Vinegar can be a great cleaning ingredient, but many people dislike the vinegar smell. Adding lemon juice to vinegar when cleaning can help neutralize the vinegar smell.

Countertops - Countertop stains can be removed by allowing lemon juice to sit on the stain for a few minutes. Scrub the area with baking soda and watch the stains disappear. Don't leave the lemon juice sitting for too long. It can be powerful stuff.

Drains - Lemon rinds can be ground in the garbage disposal to freshen the drain. Hot water with a little lemon poured down a drain will also freshen the drain.

Bleaching - Lemon juice acts as a natural bleaching agent. Put lemon juice onto white linens and clothing and allow them to dry in the sun. Stains will be bleached away.



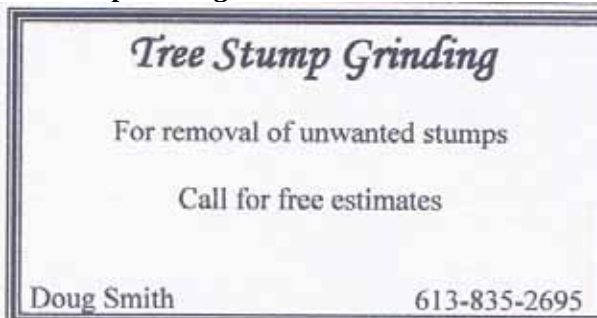
