On May 14th, 2010, Cairine Wilson held their annual 12 hour Relay for Life to raise funds for Cancer.



Twenty Five Survivors and their families and friends were piped to the stage at the Navan Fairgrounds at 12 noon. Waiting to welcome them, were 285 students from Cairine Wilson Secondary School and 13 students from Terry Fox Elementary School. Along with the students were parents, family members, friends, and special guests such as Rob Jellett and John Shea. The speeches at the Opening Ceremony and Luminary Ceremony were inspiring and the day was truly incredible. The amount raised was over \$38,000 bringing the 7 year total to almost \$218,000.

Eric Smith and his wife Dinah arrived in Navan in 2001. They were pleased to find a beautiful home not too far from their daughter, Erin Zintel and her family. Now they could see the grand kids a lot more often and help out with the little ones.

Eric was raised in Navan, went to the Continuation School here, then to Normal School. He didn't teach very long as he signed up to help in the war effort. After signing up he became a pilot and what a career he had! Marshall Rathwell, mayor at the time he applied to go into the air force, said of him, "He is fast, fearless, and very clever." He proved this many times over as he flew 58 missions and received The Distinguished Flying Cross for his bravery. He later flew 50 missions in the Korean War. It was in 1953 that he met Dinah and after a whirlwind courtship they married. They lived in England for a few years and upon their return to Canada, Erin was born. Eric retired from the Air Force after a very successful career, to take up selling real estate in the Kemptville area. There they bought a farm and lived happily for 35 years. He and Dinah have wonderful memories of the farm and the friends they made there. But in 2001 they came to Navan, ready to enjoy this new period of their life together.

It wasn't long before Eric met Ross Bradley, who convinced him to join the Navan Curling Club. Dinah curled too for a little while but it is Eric that runs up and down the sheets of ice to throw those rocks!! He is still proving those words that Mr. Rathwell said of him, way back when. He is fast, fearless, and clever when playing the game! I hope you come back in the fall Eric and celebrate your 90th birthday on our ice!

Meanwhile anyone who wants to know their family's history, Eric can tell you a story or two about them. He is very knowledgeable about Navan's local history. I love the fact that he knew my Dad. Keep well Eric and Dinah. Enjoy this 57th anniversary year together in Navan

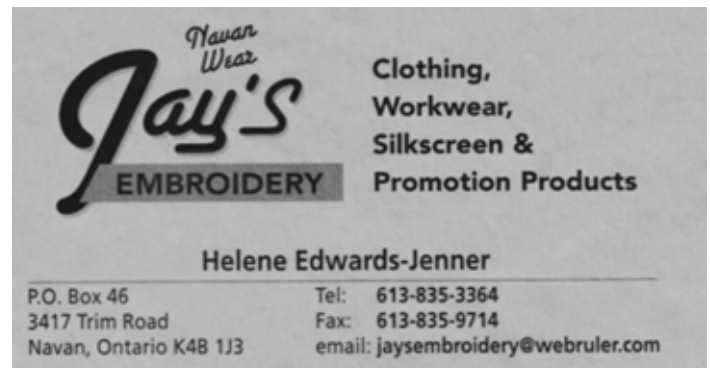


NAVAN LIONS CLUB

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NAVAN CENOTAPH RESTORATION AND RELOCATION PROJECT

The project has undergone some real excitement during the month of May. It all began on the afternoon of Thursday April 29 in the lounge of the Curling Club, when Waste Services Inc. and the Friends of the Mer Bleue Community Fund presented a cheque for \$40,000 to the Navan Cenotaph Restoration fund. This of course is a huge boost to the project's fund raising campaign and is sincerely appreciated as it is for all funds from those who contributed to date.

On May 15 and 16 a blitz took place in Navan and environs when 10 volunteers dropped off the Cenotaph brochure to every household. This very informative brochure presents the entire story of the Cenotaph project. Project urges everyone to support it. Instructions on how to donate to the Navan Cenotaph Restoration Fund are included in the brochure. We still have a way to go to reach our goal of \$140,000 so donations are still required. All contributions will be recognized in the program which will be printed for the Cenotaph's unveiling ceremony to be held in the autumn. As you can imagine there are some interesting events coming up soon which will impact on the Cenotaph Project. First of all "Ambush Under the Domes" happens on Friday evening, June 4, jointly sponsored by J.T. Bradley's, the CTAS (Navan Fair), the Navan Community Association, the Navan Curling Club and the Navan Lions Club. Advance tickets are available now and you can pick them up at the store. Part of the proceeds from this community event will go to the Cenotaph Restoration Fund. The on Saturday afternoon, August 14, at 1:00pm, right after the Fair Parade, a sod turning ceremony will take place at the new site of the Restored Cenotaph. This of course is located at the grassed area just east of the Arena's front parking lot. And everyone is encouraged to visit our Information Booth at the Fair which will be located in the foyer of the Arena. Once the Fair is over, the existing Cenotaph will be removed from its present location, for restoration at Eastern Ontario Memorials Kemptonville. If you would like to learn more about the Cenotaph Project, drop in to J.T. Bradley's and see the PowerPoint presentation on the flat screen TV. We believe you will be impressed.

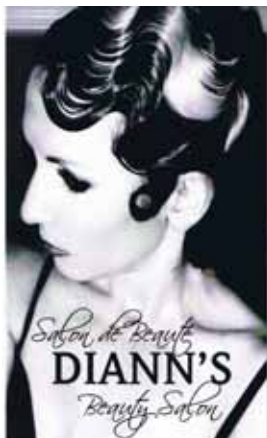
JUNE 27TH – STRAWBERRY SOCIAL

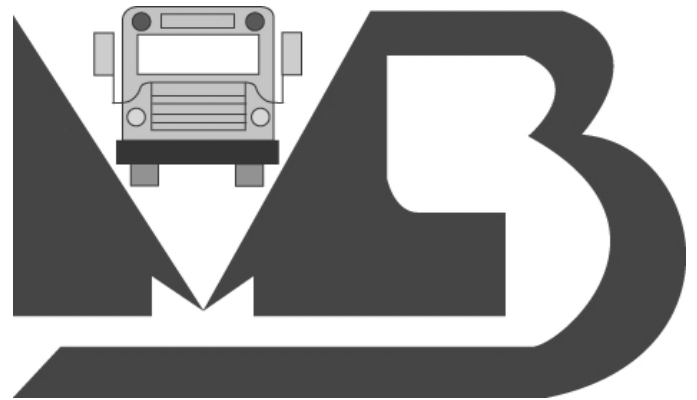

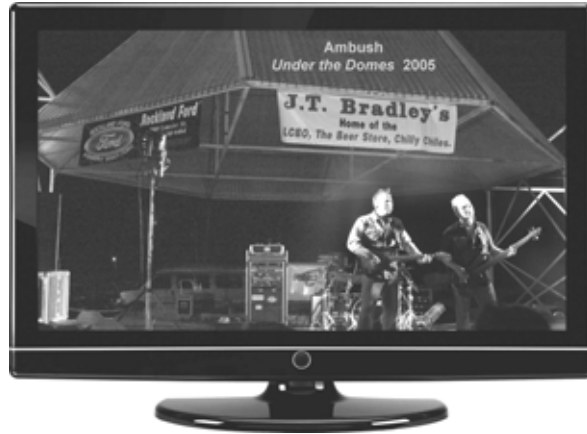
