U PDATE ON THE NAVAN CENOTAPH RESTORATION AND RELOCATION

We all remember the great party that was held under the Domes on Friday evening, June 4th when "Ambush" made another spectacular visit to Navan. That event provided a donation of \$10,000 to the Cenotaph's fund raising campaign. Our community will be forever indebted to the Cumberland Township Agricultural Society for the use of their excellent facility, to the Navan Community Association which made sure everyone got into the party without incident, to the Navan Curling Club for ensuring the right thirst quenchers were on hand, to the Navan Lions Club who showed us all why they are without a doubt the best BBQers around, and John Bradley for organizing the whole event. Let's not forget the weatherman too. The rain didn't start until well after midnight. Everything is going well with the project to date. Even so, we still have a way to go to reach our target of \$140,000. If you are considering a donation this is a great time to do it. - Sat. Aug. 14th at 1pm – Sod turning ceremony will take place in the Memorial Park (east side of Arena parking lot) right after the Navan Fair Parade. Several VIP's will attend and everyone at the Fair and from all over the community are urged to come to this event.
- Tue. Aug. 17th construction is scheduled to begin and hopefully it will all be completed during the first week of October.

And yes, don't forget to visit the information booth at the Fair which will be located in the main foyer of the Arena. It will have a beautiful artist's rendition of what the Cenotaph will look like in the Memorial Park as well as a scale model of the whole project, trees, flag and all!

- Competition will take place at the Navan Fair fundraiser meal on Friday, August 6th, 2010.

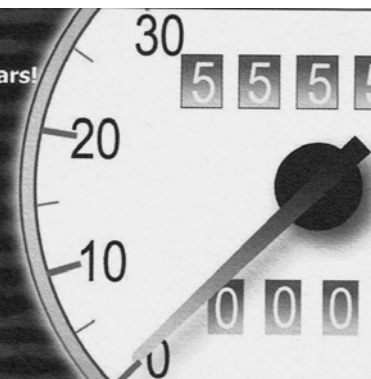

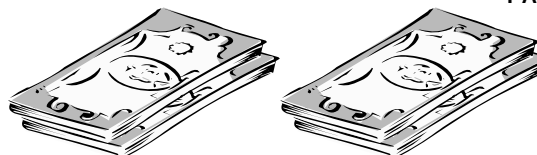

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HELP WANTED

Grounds

The grounds division starts setting up for the Navan Fair on Monday, August 2nd. Work continues during the fair and for the week following the fair. Students can either obtain their 40 hours of volunteer work and/or can be hired to be part of the grounds division. Workers will be paired up during their allocated shift(s). Safety Footwear (such as Steel toed boots) is mandatory for all persons working in the grounds division. Workers must supply their own foot wear.

Job Description:

- Designated individuals at least 16 years old may operate Navan Fair equipment
- Collection of Garbage and recycle materials within and around Fair grounds
- Table/chair setup and tear down in the different divisions before and after the Fair
- Cleaning of barns, buildings and rest areas

- Moving of picnic tables, chairs etc.
- Erecting and tear down of fence
- General maintenance functions including painting
- Other related duties as required by the Grounds Director

Shifts

We are hoping to schedule 3 different shifts during the Fair (depending on the number of people that are interested) with the morning shift starting at around 6:00am and the night shift ending around 10:00pm (workers must have their own transportation to and from the Fair Grounds). Lunch Room/Break Area is available with a fridge so that workers can bring their own lunches.

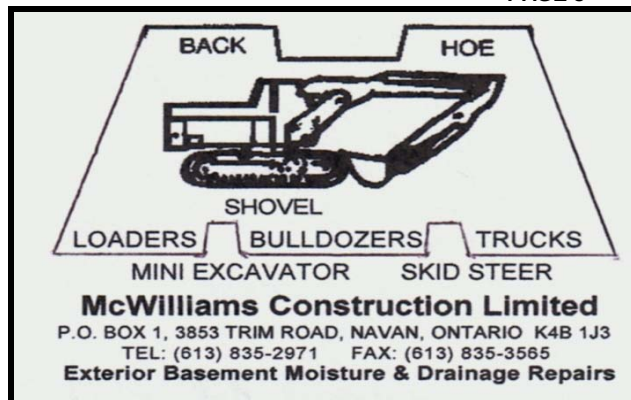

HOME TIP OF THE MONTH

Kitchen:

- Keep your pots and pans, canned goods and staple foods in locations and/or cupboards between knee and shoulder height
- Buy automatic shut off switches for appliances such as kettles, electric frying pans and toaster ovens

Living Room:

- Make sure area rugs and mats have a non-skid backing or are secured to the floor
- Arrange furniture so that you have a clear path
- Keep electrical cords out of the paths where you walk

Bathroom:

- Install a non-skid mat, runner, strips or rubber mat in the bottom of the bathtub and shower
- Install grab bars in and around the bathtub, shower and toilet
- Consider a bath seat
- Use a hand held shower head
- Consider a raised toilet seat to make getting on and off easier
- Ensure the hallway to the bathroom is well lit and clear of clutter

Bedroom:

- Keep eye glasses, hearing aids and/or mobility aids (cane, walker) within close reach from the bed

- Consider using cordless phones to eliminate rushing to the phone
- Keep a flashlight nearby in case of an emergency
- Have a lamp within arms reach of your bed
- Use a night light to provide a well lit path

Safety Check:

- Have a door viewer in addition to good lighting so you can see people before opening the door
- Keep all doors and windows locked at all times
- Use night lights to brighten hall ways, bathrooms and stairways
- Ask a friend or family member to be your "buddy", a person who you can call in case of concern
- Check the batteries in all smoke and carbon monoxide detectors on a regular basis
- If you are planning to be away, put lights on timers
- Ask someone to pick up your mail, cut your lawn or shovel your snow when you are away

**NAVAN COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION****5 REASONS WHY YOU SHOULD STOOP AND SCOOP**

Dogs are good buddies. Whatever the season, they're ready... playing fetch, sleeping in front of the fireplace, hanging out with the kids or going for a walk.

As a dog owner, by complying with the City of Ottawa's Animal Care and Control By-law and removing waste left by your pet, you will help eliminate a source of pollution. You will be making a difference! Here's why:

1. Dog waste adds up
 - The 93,000 dogs in Ottawa produce an estimated 45,000 pounds (20,500 kilograms) of waste per day!
 - When you stoop and scoop, sidewalks, parks and green spaces are much cleaner.
2. It is a health hazard
 - Leaving your dog's waste in areas where children play exposes kids to parasites such as roundworms, as well as bacterial infections.
 - Dog waste can transmit diseases to other people's pets.
3. It is an environmental hazard
 - No matter where you live, spring run-off or heavy rainstorms dilute dog waste and wash it into streams and storm sewers.
 - Water from storm sewers generally flows untreated into the rivers.

- At these times, dog waste contributes to the river's bacterial content, polluting beaches and waterways, and degrading the natural environment for fish, wildlife and people.

4. Removing dog waste is responsible

- If we all clean up after our dogs, public opinion of dogs and dog ownership will be much more positive.

5. Dog waste can cost you

- The City of Ottawa's Animal Care and Control By-law requires that dog waste be removed from public property. If you do get caught "in the act", you may be fined.
- The by-law also requires that dog waste be disposed of at the dog owner's home - so don't leave it in park or street waste receptacles! There's a fine for that too.

Dog Waste - It's your business**1. Pick it up**

- Use a bag or a shovel to pick up the waste and take it home for disposal.

2. Disposal

- The best method of disposal is to flush waste down the toilet. **BUT DON'T FLUSH THE BAG!** Toilets flow to the sewage treatment plant or septic tanks. Both systems are equipped to handle this kind of waste. Flushing poop also helps us divert waste from the landfill site.

The City of Ottawa Trees Reforestation and Environmental Enhancement (TREE) program celebrated a milestone with the planting of its 100,000th tree in Ottawa since the inception of the program in 2007.

The ceremonial 100,000th tree was planted on the lawn of City Hall, near the location of the program's first tree planted in May 2007.

The TREE program is not the City's only successful tree planting initiative. It also funds the Green Acres program, a rural Ottawa reforestation project managed and delivered by the three local Conservation Authorities. This year the Green Acres program will reach 1,000,000 trees planted. The TREE program officially ends this fall, but residents are still able to order their own tree through the City's TREE program by visiting

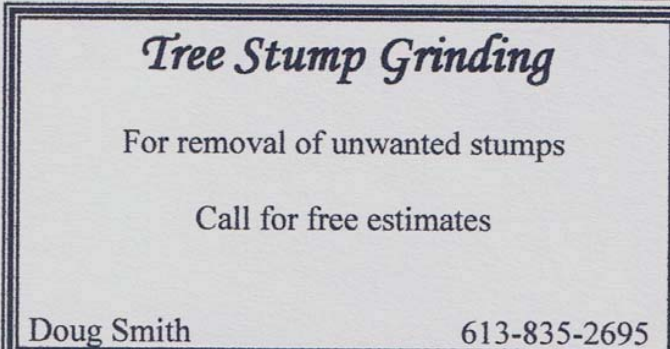

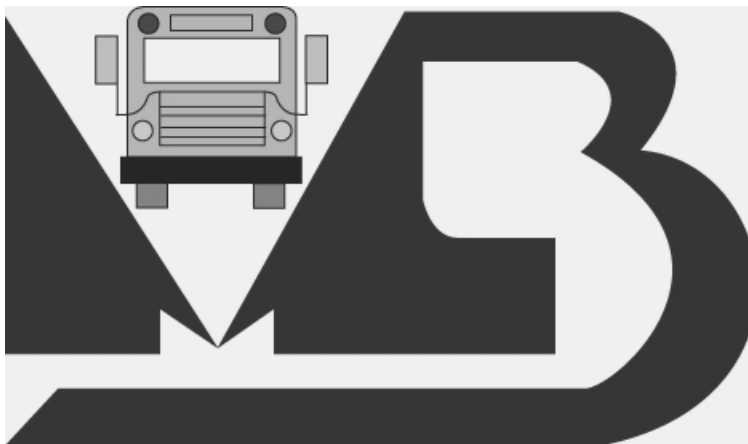
