**It's Thanksgiving - So Let's Thank a Farmer
Stan Edwards**

Stan lives at Cloverhurst farm, a dairy farm, just down from the village on Trim Road. He came to his little bit of heaven in 1944. Since the age of 15, he has worked hard on the farm. From then on he loved being outdoors, being his own boss, working with the animals. The years were filled with family and friends. He and Hilda had 3 boys and now he has many grand children and a great grandchild. Wonderful! His farm is a state of the art operation these days. 2 sons work the farm. The milking is done by computer. It is a fantastic sight to see. Cows coming by themselves to be milked by a machine! Then all the data is loaded into the computer and ready for the sons to see how well the cows are milking. Gone are the bucket and stool! Gone is the 4:30 AM wakeup call. Unbelievable back in 1944!

The herd consists mostly of Holstein cows with a few Ayrshires. The milking equipment is stainless steel making the milking area more sanitary. The cows milk 24 hours a day. Computers allow the farmer to see what is going on in the barn without him being there. High tech has made farming a big business. Stan and Hilda were married for 49 years when she died in 2001. She was a great partner as she cooked meals for the farm workers as well as for her family. She did everything on the farm except bale the hay! Hilda was the musical director at the Navan Vars United Church for many a year. She was the organizer for the big dinners at the hall where the village women would serve 800 hungry people. She was an active Navan Women's Institute member. They belonged to the Friendship Club. Their Christmas parties were fun affairs. I used to love watching Stan and Hilda on the dance floor. They seem to dance on air! Stan can remember planning the first Navan Fair at the old school. He remembers Arthur Charbonneau trailing his big bull behind the wagon down Trim to the Fair. Norm Rivington Sr. entered his young pigs and Stan his hens. Cecil Thorpe showed his red pigs! I wonder if these are the same as pink pigs? The Fair has sure come a long way from the one day affair to our 4 day one these days! Stan is retired now leaving most of the work to Wayne and Glen. He is involved in the Church Choir. His best friend, Lois Thomas, loves to dance. Many nights you'll

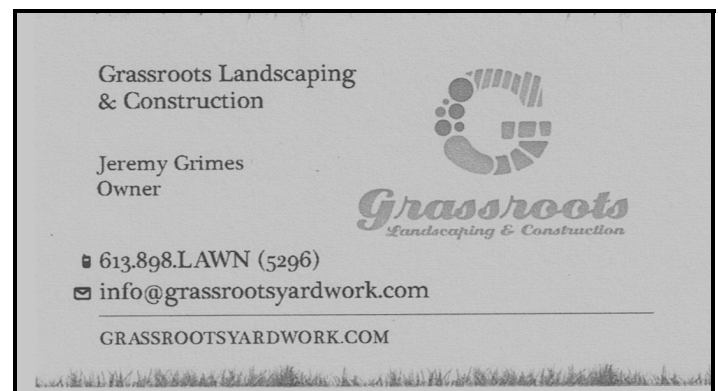
find them in a hall in the countryside dancing to the Old Time Fiddlers. On Sunday mornings you'll find him at the local restaurant, after church, having breakfast and always ready with a tale or two. He sure knows how to make a person smile!!! So as you have your glass of milk this Thanksgiving dinner, think of Stan and other farmers like him, and say a little prayer of thanks for their energy, hard work, and dedication to the land! DO YOU KNOW WHERE YOUR CHILDREN ARE?

There has been a rash of vandalism, graffiti and thefts to vehicles around the village and Centennial Park as of late. Although the NCA has requested more police patrols to the area, it is still the residents' responsibility to ensure this type of behavior does not continue. It is doubtful youth from Orleans are coming to our neighbourhood to commit these acts. It is likely our children who are responsible for this and the NCA requests that parents take extra precaution to ensure they are aware of their children's whereabouts at all times, specifically during the late evening hours. Talk to your children, their friends and don't be afraid to ask questions, check their bags, hands and bedrooms for spray paint or large permanent paint markers. We all live in Navan because of how peaceful this community is and we are able to avoid the problems of larger cities. Let's all get together and find a solution to this problem before it gets worse. Any victim of vandalism, graffiti or theft, no matter how minor in nature, should report the incident to the Ottawa Police by telephone at (613) 236-1222 ext. 7300. It is important to report all crime, as police resources are deployed in accordance to where crime occurs and it reported. The NCA has asked the City to start enforcing the Park By-Law relating to Parks

being closed from 11 pm to 5 am - Section 3(1)(a) of the Ottawa Parks By-Law,
HOURS OF OPERATION

3. (1) No person shall:

- a. remain or enter into any park between the hours of 11:00 o'clock in the afternoon (p.m.) and 5:00 o'clock in the forenoon (a.m.) except as a participant or spectator of a function approved by the Director;

Vandalism: September 18th - several bus stops and light posts were spray painted around Delson/Villeroy In the Park someone defecated on the new large play structure, the bench and spread feces around the sand. Toilet paper was also left on and around the structure.

Vehicles have been damaged along Colonial and Trim Road on September 25th.

Speeding along side streets: Complaints of residents driving at excessive rates of speed along Delson, Villeroy Henn, Mustang and Forest. Again, having police conduct traffic enforcement on side roads is not practicable due to the light traffic volume and resources it would require. The NCA would like to ask the all residents to be aware of the dangers we place our neighbours' children when speeding along these streets, specifically prior/after school hours and on week-ends.

A request has been made to the City to erect signs posting this By-Law at the Wickham Court and Fairgreen (Curling Club) entrance to the park.

COMMUNITY ANNOUNCEMENT

RECREATIONAL PATHWAY

Works will soon begin on the abandoned Via rail line which connects to the Prescott-Russell recreational trail (to the east). An investment of 2.0 M.

"Finally residents will be able to enjoy the pathway" says Councillor Rob Jellett. The finished project will consist of a 3 m wide stone dust pathway suitable for walking, running and cycling. At approximately 22 km long the path will go from Anderson road to Canaan Road (near Magladry Road).

"This is great news for the community, and we have been waiting for a long time for this to become real" says Councillor Jellett. There will be 3 parking areas provided (Anderson, Smith and Dunning Roads), where you can park and then get on the recreational trail.

Construction is scheduled to begin in a few weeks with completion by the end of December 2010.

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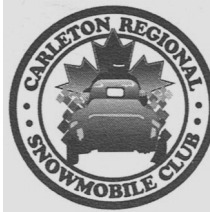
