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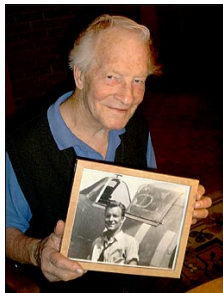
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Dr Irving Farmer "Bus" Kennedy passed away on January 6th

World War II Spitfire ace and Cumberland resident Dr. I. F. "Bus" Kennedy flew 329 missions during the war, twice earning the Distinguished Flying Cross.

At the start of the Second World War, "Bus" enlisted in the RCAF and became a Spitfire pilot. He flew numerous missions over the island of Malta prior to the invasion of Sicily in 1943 and earned a Distinguished Flying Cross for his prowess in the cockpit. He was shot down after flying several missions during the invasion of Normandy until 1945.

Following the war, "Bus" went to medical school and eventually opened a practice in Cumberland Village in 1961. He presided over the births of hundreds of present day residents before retiring in the late 70's. Bus then wrote a book about his war time experiences entitled "Black Crosses Off My Wingtip". He was one of this country's heroes and a wonderful gentleman.

NAVAN FOR KRAFT HOCKEYVILLE 2011



Navan Kraft Hockeyville – Vintage Hockey day on Jan. 9th was a wonderful event that looked like old home week at the Navan Memorial Centre. Area residents, both young and old had a chance to view the hockey photos and artifacts dating back more than a century. They were joined by famous hockey professionals (NHLer Matt Bradley, now playing with the Washington Capitals and Boston Bruins head coach Claude Julien) who both credit Navan's hockey community for helping them on their path to professional hockey careers. The oldest artifact was a hockey stick used in the early 1900's by a member of the original Navan Hockey Club formed in 1913. Bob Burns brought the goalie skates he wore while playing for the hometown team in the 1950's. 89-years-old Eric Smith brought the first pair of skates he ever owned which were purchased in 1935 for \$24.95. He would wear them for the next 31 years including the 1948 Bradley Cup in which he scored 5 goals in an 8-0 win.

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HOME TIP OF THE MONTH

Grow the healthiest houseplants

1. Give them the carrot or broccoli cooking water (unsalted) which will fertilize your plants.
2. Sprinkle used coffee grounds around the top will to provide nutrients.
3. Let tap water sit for 24 hours before using it to water plants – waiting allows harmful chemicals to evaporate.
4. Lack of humidity is a problem for indoor plants, so by grouping them together allows them to benefit from each other's moisture.

Six hundred families who lost everything last January are now moving into new homes, thanks to LCIF and Lions around the world by working directly with the Lions Clubs in Haiti. 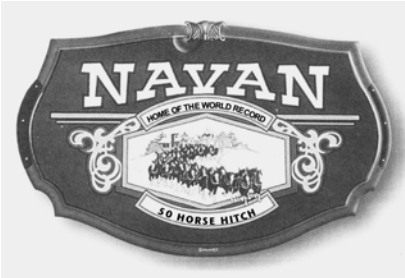

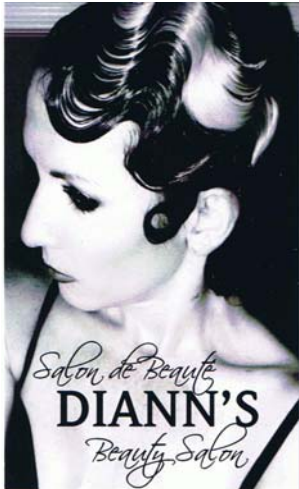

2011 PLANNING PRIMER PROGRAM

Have you ever wondered how land-use planning is done? What those black and white signs in your community mean? How a zoning application is made? How to make a presentation to Planning Committee? What land-use planners do for your community?

Now is your time to find out

The Planning and Growth Management Department offers the Planning Primer Program to help residents become more aware of, and more involved in, the land-use planning process. The program is a series of half-day courses. The series includes two core courses and two elective courses.

The core courses, called Primer I and Primer II, describe the legislative and policy basis under which land-use planning decisions are made, the way policy documents are amended and how to make a development application.

The elective courses for 2011 include a session on Parks Planning in April and another topic to be announced later this year.

To make the most of the information being presented, residents must attend the Primer I course before attending Primer II and attend both the Primer I and II courses before attending an elective course. The content of these Primer courses is the same as those offered in previous years. The courses are offered in English only.

Primer II Course on Saturday, February 12, 2011 or Monday, February 14

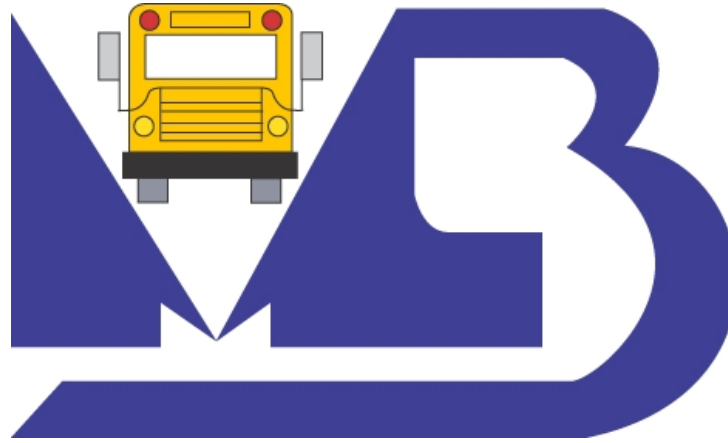

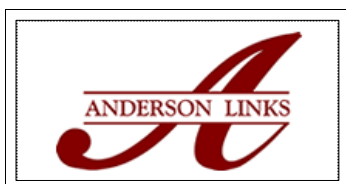
