Restoring Hope to Haitians

Today, hope is something often gone unnoticed in the devastated nation. Even before the historic earthquake, poverty and disorder were widespread. Now, everyday life is even more difficult. People struggle for necessities like food, water and shelter. More than one million people remain homeless one year later. Renande Pierre-Louis, her husband and six children are the first beneficiaries recently moved into a newly constructed home.



LCIF is working with HELP, a German non-governmental relief organization (NGO), to provide the homes. HELP has a 30-year history in providing humanitarian assistance. In nearly 20 countries around the world, the organization supports communities based on need. In Haiti, HELP is reconstructing homes for victims of the earthquake.

To identify beneficiaries, Lions and HELP surveyed each camp to find people with the greatest need to relocate. Once homes are complete, beneficiaries will receive basic furniture for their houses. In addition, latrines and other essentials will be provided for the community.

At this time, no other NGO is supporting provisional housing, even though there is a considerable need.

The 600 homes significantly add to the number of provisional houses in Haiti, as only 5,000 have been built to date. Still, nearly 225,000 are needed. The end goal is to shift all people living in Lions' tents to provisional housing.

Lions and LCIF have had a strong presence in Haiti since the earthquake struck. After the disaster, a \$50,000 Major Catastrophe Grant was awarded. Funds were used to purchase relief supplies including bottled water, medical aid and food. Three tent cities in the Port-au-Prince neighborhoods of Delmas, Blanchard and Carrefour-Feuille were established to house people who lost their homes. Nearly 2,500 people still reside in these establishments. The tent cities have become communities in a sense, providing essential needs for the provides medical care.

Moving forward, LCIF remains committed to rebuilding Haiti. Projects will be implemented over the long-term, but providing hope for people in need is central to the mission of Lions. Similar to other disasters, Lions hope to rebuild homes and hospitals, redevelop the eye care delivery system, and provide help for those with disabilities, including those disabled because of this disaster.

Restoring hope to Haitians will offer them a better future, much like Pierre-Louis and her family. LCIF is dedicated to restoring this hope for years to come.

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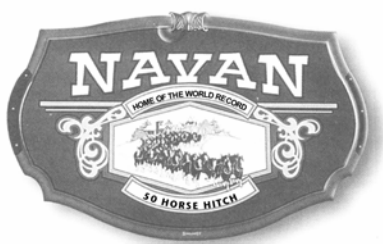

OFFICIAL PLAN – RURAL LAND USE REVIEW

On February 16th the Rural Affairs office arranged a kick off meeting with the Community Associations for Cumberland, Sarsfield, Vars, Notre Dame Des Champs, Carlsbad, and Navan. Over 20 representatives were present to hear about the

projects involved in the rural policies of the City's Official Plan. They are:

- Future village development – for example, land use, servicing and infrastructure, environmental protection, greenspace and community design.
- Clustering of country estate lots – what kind of development is appropriate and how much?
- Land Evaluation and Area Review (LEAR) – a process to review and confirm prime agricultural land designations.
- Mineral resources study – a review of the best management practices of the aggregate industry.
- Drive-through facilities in village core areas – whether or not to permit drive-through facilities in a village core or along village mainstreet.

Public workshops are planned in the locations listed below for residents to hear about the projects and provide input for YOUR future Village vision and land use issues in YOUR village.

- Sarsfield, Navan, Carlsbad, Notre Dame Des Champs - **Sat. Mar 26th – 9am – 12pm** – Navan Curling Club
- Cumberland - **Mon. Apr. 5 – 6pm-9pm** – Maple Hall
- Vars – **Sat. Apr. 9 – 9am-12pm** – Bearbrook Community Centre

To help with this process the City has a "Rural Land Use Questionnaire" available on their website. Residents are encouraged to read the Rural Land Discussion Paper before filling out this questionnaire. 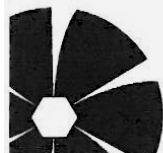
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**CITY UNVEILS NEW RURAL CLEAN WATER PROGRAM**

The Ottawa Rural Clean Water Grants Program (ORCWGP) has been amended for 2011-2015. The project will provide \$200,000 in funding each year, subject to City Council approval, for projects that protect groundwater and surface water such as:

- Buffer Strips
- Grassed Waterways
- Livestock Restrictions
- Land Retirement
- Streambank Stabilization
- Tile Outlet Repairs
- Tile Drain Control Systems
- Well Decommissioning
- Educational Initiatives
- Precision Farming
- Manure Storage
- Milkhouse Washwater Treatment
- Chemical/Fuel Storage and Handling
- Clean Water Diversion and Leachate Seepage
- Nutrient/Turf Management Plan
- Natural Windbreaks

The biggest change to the program is that it will no longer fund well and septic projects except well decommissioning. The City is considering a separate program to address well and septic projects.

The program is delivered in partnership with the local Conservation Authorities (CAs) of Ottawa (Mississippi Valley Conservation, Rideau Valley Conservation Authority, and South Nation Conservation).

ORCWGP is also working in partnership with Ontario Soil and Crop Improvement Association (OSCIA) to streamline ORCWGP applications from farmers who are also applying to cost-share programs administered by OSCIA (e.g. Canada-Ontario Farm Stewardship Program (COFSP) and Species at Risk Farm Incentive Program (SARFIP)).

The deadline to apply is May 1, 2011. This program is subject to City Council budget approval. For more information, please visit ottawa.ca/cleanwater.

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COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP MAJOR CAPITAL PROGRAM

The City of Ottawa Community Partnership Major Capital Program is an initiative to implement major capital improvements and additions to facilities related to parks and recreation and community resource centres on a cost-sharing basis between the City and community groups. The project may relate to an asset that is owned by the City, or operated by a community partner who delivers service on behalf of the City or assists the City in the delivery of programs and services. The funding program applies to major capital programs for new facilities, renovations and expansions. It will only apply to fixed assets. It will not fund other components such as furniture, equipment, feasibility or fundraising studies.
