Navan on the Cutting Edge of Clean Energy

Helena and Shawn Simpson are involved in this Clean Energy Program established by the Ontario government. The Sentry Dual Access Tracker, on Colonial Road, is the latest in Clean Energy. Shawn Simpson and John McWilliams are selling these Ontario made machines through their business, SMS Solar Harvesting. This solar tracker will help in supplying clean energy needs. Anyone can obtain a contract with the government for a 20 year term to produce renewable energy. This unit uses gps coordinates to know where it is on the earth to track the sun. The anemometer, at the very top of the panels, measures the wind velocity. Should the wind reach speeds of 50km an hour the tracker lies flat to prevent damage to itself. The device is attached to the Internet so that the owners can monitor each individual panel and its output. If something goes wrong with 1 panel they receive an email about it. This solar tracker works at maximum efficiency and is self-maintained, except for minor greasing every 6 months.

Anyone interested in learning more about this Clean Energy Initiative can go to the Ontario Power Authority web site. Shawn is very pleased with his new initiative. It has produced above expectations. Exciting field to be working in for this local electrical company!!

further investigation. It is hoped that, in the future, we will be able to conduct further clinics in other local schools.



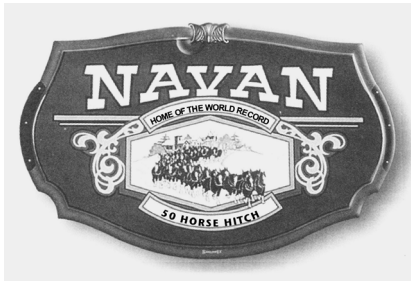

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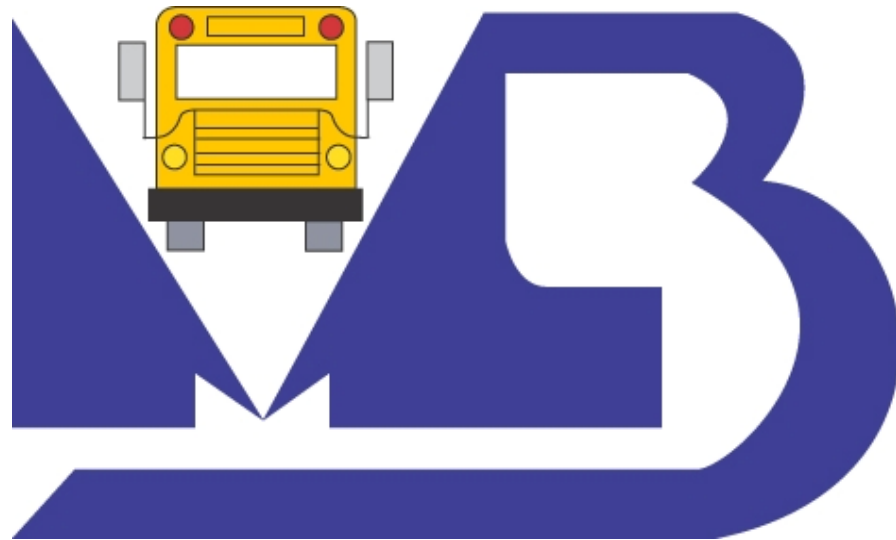

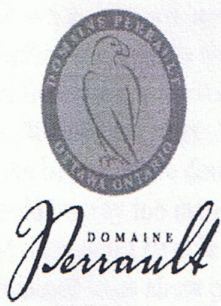
