Education Rules and Regulations

- Exhibitors must enter in the grade they just completed as of June 2011
- No identification marks on the front of the entries
- Only one entry piece per item in each grade category
- Entries should be emailed to kimberly_a_locas@hotmail.com or phone Kim at 613-833-0004 by Tuesday, August 9 so that tags may be made in advance. Please provide the first and last name of the child, the grade and category(s) they are entering.
- Due to space limitations, items should not be any bigger than 8.5" x 11" unless otherwise stated.
- All paintings, drawings, etc. should be mounted on a solid coloured piece of construction paper with a border of at least 1 cm showing.
- Judging will be based on A) Overall appeal; B) Creativity (original work); C) Effective use of colour, space and materials; D) Neatness and organization
- All entries must be the work of the exhibitor. Projects completed during the 2010-11 school year are eligible.
- Exhibits are to be brought to the Exhibit Building (Blue Building) on Wednesday, August 11, between 6:00 pm and 8:00 pm.
- Judging will take place on Thursday, August 11. The building will be closed for judging and will reopen once the judging is finished.

It will remain closed until approximately 4:00 pm.

- Exhibits must be left on display until Sunday, August 14th, and can be picked up after 4:00 pm. The Board is not responsible for items or prizes unclaimed after 6:00 pm on Sunday evening.
- Prize money will be ready for pick up at the Fair Office any time after Noon on Friday, August 12th.
- Any prizes not claimed by the end of September, 2011 will be considered a donation to the Cumberland Township Agricultural Society.

Note to Parents and Entrants

Due to the nature of this division, entries not phoned or emailed ahead will not be refused; although every effort should be made to register your entries prior to August 9th, via email or by phone.

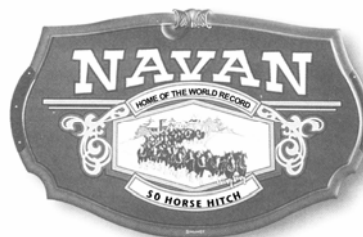

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NAVAN IRELAND IS OPEN FOR BUSINESS

When Michael O'Meara and his wife Julia Madden left Navan Ireland in 1841, which was a town with a military barracks and two corn mills. The market place was an opportunity

for local peasant farmers to come and trade whatever small wares they had to pay their rent to mostly absentee land lords. In leaving, Michael and Julie were lucky because worse was to follow for those they left behind. 1845 saw the beginning of the great famine in Ireland AN Gorta Mor which was the greatest natural disaster every to befall Europe even out stripping the black death, the plague carried by rats that hit western Europe in the middle ages. At the beginning of the famine Ireland had a population of over 8 million citizens mainly living on the potatoe crops and when this crop failed our population starved or left our fair shores. Our population figure today is not quite 5 million in total and has never recovered from the bleak days when famine claimed entire families, communities and towns. Navan county Meath became the home of a state run work house, a place of last resort for the starving population. Due to the fact a local landlord could not pick up rent he abandoned an area in the centre of the Navan town which became the home of a mud walled shanty town for those who could not be placed inside the workhouse due to over capacity. The story goes locally of work house employees twice a day pushing hand made carts with two wheels through this shanty town to gather the dead to place them in a mass grave behind what is now Our lady's hospital Navan. It is believed hundred if not search of a new life in a new world, Canada. The Navan town Ireland of the 1840s where thousands are buried - RIP. But we were the lucky one at least our town survived and while our living population started their new lives in places like Grosse Ile in Canada those who remained never lost heart

or faith . Less than 100 years after these traumatic events with the foundation of the Irish state Navan Ireland became the centre of the carpet and furniture making industry in Ireland and we even boast of being the home of the largest lead and zinc mine in Europe, open of course by a Canadian company ,Tara mines. The Navan of the new millennium is the third largest town in Ireland having a population of over 30 thousand people. It is a multi national multi cultured society connected to Dublin our capital city by motorway. It is the town of a thousand welcomes "Cead Mile failte" and the home of the shamrock and is very much opened for business. We are home to some of the best fishing in the country and nestled in the heart of the royal county of Meath home of the high kings of Ireland. We have sights of immense historical importance around every corner waiting to be discovered and enjoyed.

It never rains here, yet our grass is very green and our cattle are black and white, the sun always shines and the people of our town are always smiling and love chatting about things like the lack of rain and the price of turnips. Now to prove me wrong you will have to come and see for yourself and when you do look me up we can have a drink or two in one of our many hostleries where you can call me a liar to my face. See you soon, Navan county Meath Ireland your twin is open for business and very anxious to meet you.

The delegation of Betty Wall-Neilands, Dave O'Neill and Marg MacNeill to Navan Ireland was to visit the town we received our name from and to initiate future twinning opportunities. It was an

unbelievable experience. We were picked up at the Dublin airport by a Navan taxi driver and driven to Navan in County Meath. As soon as we checked in to our Bed & Breakfast, there was an invitation from the Mayor of Navan Phil Brennan, to join him and the councillors for a special presentation of the history of Navan and beautiful wooden plaque at the town hall. Then we proceeded of to a wonderful lunch at the Newgrange Hotel.

When we got back to our B&B there were tickets waiting for us for a musical night at the local art centre from the Shannon Festival committee. This was a fantastic evening of a variety of different bands, choirs and dancers ranging from Celtic to classical music. One band was made up of 14 accordion players – a first for me. After the show, we were met by Patrick Pryle, who is the chair of the Shannon Festival (St Patrick's Parade) who escorted

us to a local pub which became our meeting place for the next 5 days. Patrick had arranged for a banner and Canadian Flag for us to carry in the parade and surprised us with the idea that we would be coming down the Boyne River with St Patrick before the parade started.

St Patrick's Day, was a beautiful day (20c), after coming down the river on the Sea and Rescue boats, we were placed at the beginning of the parade which lasted for 2 hours and the streets were lined with thousands of people. St Paul's middle school students walked in the parade with banners linking the two Navan's. I made arrangements for the students to get our "I Love Navan" stickers which were a hit. In the future we are hoping to get some communications going back and forth with Heritage Public School. Just before the parade, we met Noreen Walshe, a local painter, who has been to Canada and attended Art classes in Nova Scotia. Noreen invited us to her home with her husband Gerry cooked a 4 course meal and the atmosphere that evening was just like going to your best friends.

We were fortunate to meet up with three members of the Lions Club for lunch on Friday. Lion Fionnula Keane is the first lady Lion in the Navan Club and now President which is similar to my Lion history. Lion Martin Kelly is also the local Travel Agent, he will be encouraging a delegation from Navan Ireland to the Navan Fair either this year or for sure next year.

On Saturday, Patrick arranged to have a local historian give us a walking tour of the historical parts of Navan and Mayor Phil accompanied us. He was surprised to learn things that he did not know about the history of Navan. We saw parts of the walled city that dated back to the 1700's. At St Mary's Anglican Church we met Margaret Elliott, whose husband carved the Celtic cross that was presented to St Mary's Church in Navan Canada on its 75th Anniversary by the minister from their church in Ireland at that time. Patrick picked us up and took us to the historic Hill of Tara which had been the home of druids, warriors and ancient kings. From this location you can see 5 counties, the many shades of green and sheep. Then of course we had to go to the oldest pub dating back to the 1850s.

Sunday, we headed back to Dublin with the feeling that we were saying Good Bye to the many friends that we plan to see again someday soon. For the next 7 days we toured the southern part of Ireland with 20 other people from Canada and the US. It is

amazing when you get to walk in the footsteps of people who walked there in the 1100th century or sit at a table in the banquet hall that was 500 years old. At the airport, we met up with Liam Burke, who is the manager of the Navan's ice hockey team and a radio station sports announcer. Liam interviewed us about hockey in Canada, Hockeyville and about our village of Navan for a future broadcast for his listeners. The most memorable event for me was that when we returned to Dublin on the following Friday we had a message from Patrick Pryle that his wife Pamela, Catherine and Enda Sheild would drive up to Dublin to spend that last night with us. They are very special people and I am looking forward to giving them the royal treatment when they come to our Navan in the near future. All that we met extended an invitation, to all Navan's residents, to drop in for the visit.

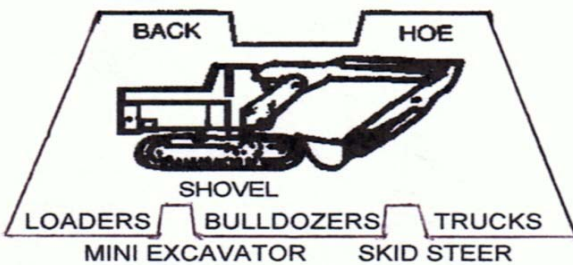

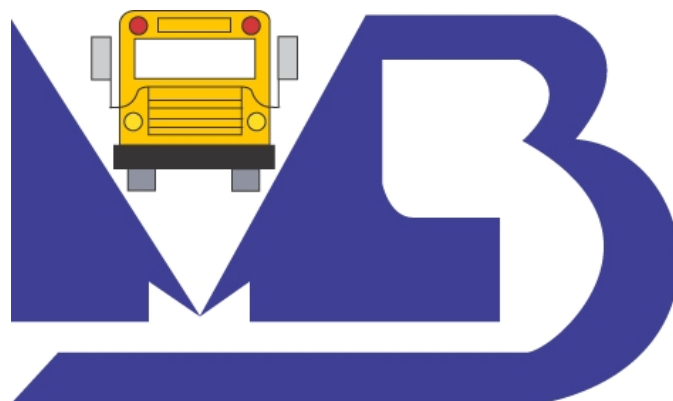
