NAVAN CELEBRATES A RICH HISTORY over the last 150 years. Here are some of the highlights that have been collected from Verna Cotton's books, Church history and 1860 census:

1830-1860 Early settler families were: Rathwell, Calvin, Wall, Dagg, Farmer, McMillan, Clarke, Jackson, MacDonald, McCullough, Hamilton, Walsh, Coburn, Dunning, Lough, Smith, Kenny just to name a few.

1860s – Michael O'Meara officially named the village after his home in Ireland.

- Cpt Herman Visser & wife Sarah (Clark) built first store (about where painted garage is today)
- First St Mary's Anglican Church (wood frame) was built in 1863 at the south west corner of Trim and Fairgreen)

1870's – Laura's Corner house was built in 1876 by Samuel Calvin and sold to William Shaw around 1880's

1884 – Thomas Clarke opened first grinding & shingle mill and had steam engine threshing machine for community.

1890's – Clarke Store and Post Office at corner was operated by William Clarke.

- Stone St Mary's Anglican Church was built at the south west corner of Trim and Smith in 1898 with stone from the quarry on Robert Shaw property (Rivington Farm now).
- John Thomas Bradley build the JT Bradley Store – still existing today.
- CPR railway station was built and operated until 1974.

1900's – George Kemp opened a blacksmith and carriage building.

- First rural telephone company in Cumberland Township switchboard at 3522 Trim then moved in 1944 to the front of where Castello's restaurant is today.

1910's – first school was opened on property on the south side of Colonial Road directly west of present Heritage PS today – first teacher was Minnie Copping

- 1915 – a four-storey brick school was build (first floor Public (G 1-8 until 1966) and second floor Continuation School (until 1952 then went to High Schools in Ottawa)

1920's – Royal Bank come in 1921 – some Bank Managers were Gordon Armstrong, Foster Nelson, Eldon Kinsella, Ronald Quinn and Winston MacDonald.

- Clifford Deavy operated a garage and gas pumps until 1940's.

-1926 the Navan-Vars United Church was build on Smith Road and incorporated windows, pulpit and organ from the former Wilson Memorial Church that was near the United Church cemetery east on Colonial

- Navan Grist Mill was operated by the Lancaster brothers up until 1993 – now The New Oak Tree

1930's – Electricity came to Navan

- Around White Pine Court there was a picnic area and a winter tobogganing hill used by the community.



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1940's – Murder in Navan of Officer OPP Harold Dent killed by John Mikki at the train station

- Modern Refrigeration Plant (residents could store quantities of food) was opened by Basil Johnston and later by Lorne Magladry.
- 1946 the Cumberland Township Agricultural Society was formed which hosts the Navan Fair annually in August – Samuel Rathwell was the first President.

1950's – First arena was built which unfortunately burned in October of the next year

- in two years a new one was built which included a small apartment
- Navan Lions Club was formed in Dec. 1952
- Navan Volunteer Fire department formed with pumper stored in Herb Deavy's garage.
- Boy Scout troop with support from Navan Lions.

1960's - CTAS erected barns on the property for the shows during the Fair.

- the old school was torn down and new building was build to house the CTAS office
- Navan Bowling league was formed
- Meadowview build in 1966 for Grades 1-8
- First street dance with the CFRA Happy Wonderers in front of JT Bradley's.
- Opening of Centennial Park - playground

1970's - The current Post Office building opened with 2 apartments above.

- Navan Restaurant was built by Jon Vos and Willard McWilliams - still operating today.
- Navan Tennis courts were started in 1976.
- The summer of 1974 saw local Navan residents band together and purchase the Rockland franchise and rename them the Cumberland Navan (CN) Grads.
- Eastern Valley Cooperative Nursery School opens in CTAS exhibit building with Rita Dessaint as the teacher

1980's - Navan arena declared unsafe and had to be demolished. Lions championed the demolition which saved over \$20,000.

- The RCMP Musical Ride rode into town for a performance at the Fairgrounds.
- Pope Domes were moved to Navan fairgrounds from Lebreton Flats by helicopter.
- 1984 the Fire Department moved to the building on Colonial Road.
- Arena # 3 was opened
- 1988 the Royal Bank moved to their current location.
- Navan Curling Club formed in 1984 with 48 members.
- Cenotaph unveiled in front of the Navan Memorial Centre

1990's - Navan Fair's 50th Fair got into the Guinness Book of World Records for their accomplishment of the 50-HorseHitch.

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Women's Institute and Lions purchase Jaws of Life for Fire Department.

- Navan Curling Club was build and has grown to over 550 members.

2000's - ernational Plowing Match was held on the Rivington Farm.

- Navan Curling Club finished their extension of lounge and a permanent home for the Navan Lions meetings.

2010's - CTAS and City of Ottawa refurbished the Domes.

Grounds

The grounds division starts setting up for the Navan Fair on Monday, August 8th. Work continues during the fair and for the week following the fair. Students can either obtain their 40 hours of volunteer work and/or can be hired to be part of the grounds division. Workers will be paired up during their allocated shift(s). Safety Footwear (such as Steel toed boots) is mandatory for all persons working in the grounds division. Workers must supply their own foot wear.

Job Description:

- Designated individuals at least 16 years old may operate Navan Fair equipment
- Collection of Garbage and recycle materials within and around Fair grounds
- Table/chair setup and tear down in the different divisions before and after the Fair
- Cleaning of barns, buildings and rest areas
- Moving of picnic tables, chairs etc.
- Erecting and tear down of fence
- General maintenance functions including painting
- Other related duties as required by the Grounds Director

We are hoping to schedule 3 different shifts during the Fair (depending on the number of people that are interested) with the morning shift starting at around 6:00am and the night shift ending around 10:00pm (workers must have their own transportation to and from the Fair Grounds). 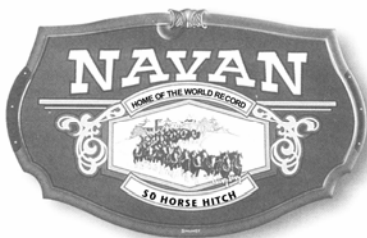

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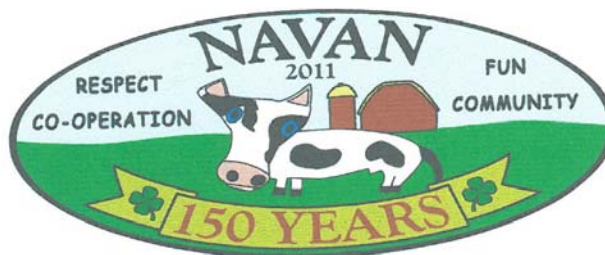

HOME TIP OF THE MONTH

In 1890's the telephone was being installed in homes of subscribers for \$15 per year for limited-hour service with up to 19 subscribers on a line. Below are the telephone etiquette rules of operating:

1. Wanting to use the phone, put receiver to ear; if line is in use put receiver back on hook and wait the required time; then request the use of the line. If line is not in use put the receiver back on hook and ring.
2. Don't drag your rings; give quick, strong ones.
3. You know your ring; answer it; let other rings alone.
4. Be patient with central; they are sometimes busy.
5. Put your mouth about half an inch from mouthpiece when talking.
6. Always hang receiver on hook with ear down: this keeps dust out of the ear.
7. Talk through the telephone in a clear natural tone; not too loud or too fast.
8. When through talking put receive on hood and give one rapid turn of the crank.
9. Put receiver on hook as soon as you are through. This saves the batteries.
10. Always endeavor to work harmoniously with every other patron.

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Navan Was Toasted!

A wine and cheese party was held in the lounge of the Curling Club by Vignoble Domaine Perrault Winery, Friday, June 19. This was part of Navan's 150th Anniversary celebrations under the sponsorship of the Navan Community Association.



Ross Bradley, a long time resident proposed a toast to Navan. The following represents the highlights of his 'toast'. They are significant events that have happened in Navan over the years which help to make this community unique.

1. Navan's history has been recorded since the mid 1930s based on a challenge by Lady Tweedsmuir, wife of Lord Tweedsmuir who was Governor General of Canada, 1935-1940. Lady Tweedsmuir urged Women's Institutes across Canada to begin recording the history of their communities. The Navan Women's Institute, formed in 1931 took up this challenge in a big way. As a result this community now boasts a marvellous record of what has transpired since that time. The Navan Tweedsmuir History consists of 3 Volumes, can be found in the main branch of the Ottawa Public Library, the Cumberland Branch of the Ottawa Library right beside the Ray Friel Centre, and at Verna Cotton's home. Verna has been responsible for keeping the records up to date for a long, long time and does an admirable job.

2. The first Navan Fair in 1946. The most memorable one probably in 1995 and the 50 horse hitch of beautiful black Clydesdales being driven through

the streets of Navan attracting 40 to 50,000 people – and it is recorded for posterity in the Guinness Book of World Records.

3. The Navan Lions Club receives its Charter from Lions International in May 1952 and is contributing all the time to the community.

4. The first Arena built in 1952, burns to the ground on Nov.1, 1953. The second opens in 1955 and is condemned by the Ontario Dept. of Labour in 1982. The third opens in 1983 and remains to this day as a beautiful Arena. It is the hub of Navan.

5. Our 2 churches in Navan are exceptionally good at undertaking joint efforts for the betterment of this community. Their shining example is the sponsorship of a Community Sunday School in 1973. It attracts children from every ethnic group and religious denomination and continues to flourish in so doing.

6. The Navan Curling Club formed in 1984, where members curled on rented ice in Ottawa on Sunday nights for seven years. Its own Club was built in 1991 and now boasts a membership of over 550.

7. The International Plowing Match was held in 2001 in the third week of September – exactly one week after 9-11. Crowds did not materialize as expected. Its commitment to the Ottawa Hospital as a legacy could not be fulfilled until several years later but when it did, well over \$400,000 was donated.

8. Local farmers spearheaded the 2002 Hay West Project to aid Western Canada farmers stricken by a severe drought. At the same time Eastern Ontario farmers had a bumper crop of hay. Tens of thousands of bales of hay were shipped to Alberta and Saskatchewan farmers.

9. The Navan Community Association was incorporated in November 2002, formed to give residents a stronger force in dealing with all levels of government.

10. Local farmers initiate Food Aid Program in 2005-2006 to aid Eastern Ontario beef farmers due to trade bans caused by the mad cow disease. When cattle were slaughtered and then processed, the hamburger produced was donated to Ottawa Food Banks. This program continues to flourish.



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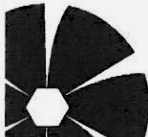
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11 2010-11. CBC and KraftHockeyville Project urges communities to enter a contest and to submit stories about peoples memories of their hockey Arenas. A prize of \$100,000 was offered to be used for Arena updates. Almost 1000 stories go into extolling the virtues of the Navan Memorial Centre. This was the most for any community in all of Canada. Stories are being saved and will result in a book to be printed to describe the whole project. Navan didn't win but the fun that was created made the community even more cohesive.

12. There is great admiration in this community for its volunteer fire fighters and their professional colleagues. Many of the old timers still remember the devastating fires of the '40s and '50s. We all sleep better every night now because of our excellent fire department. Well done Navan. Getting better every day. Ross Bradley.
