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PUBLIC NOTICE FOR RESIDENTS OF THE VILLAGE OF NAVAN

The Cumberland Township Agricultural Society would like to advise you in advance of planned street closures during some of the 2011 Navan Fair activities.

On Saturday, August 13th the traditional Fair Parade will take place. Participants will congregate in the field off Smith Road just south of Meteor Street. The Parade commences approximately at 11:00 am which will proceed along Smith Road east to Colonial, crossing over Trim and continuing east on Colonial until Delson. The Police and volunteers will be directing motorist and spectators as the Parade proceeds along its route.

On Sunday, August 14th is the Navan Fair Bed Race which will run from J.T. Bradley's Country Convenience store parking lot (1220 Colonial Road) to the corner of Trim Road and Colonial Roads and back to J.T. Bradley's Country Convenience store parking lot. The Bed Race will commence at 11:30 am run until 12:30 pm, therefore traffic will be redirected off Trim Road at Henn and then east on to Colonial Road. Funds raised will be donated to Canadian Cancer Foundation.

Restricted parking signs will be posted on Fairgreen and Delson for emergency access to the Fair grounds and livestock trailers specifically on Delson. Additional community Policing has been requested for the village during the Fair, for life-threatening or crimes in progress call 911 and all other non-emergency issues please call 613-230-6211.

On Friday, May 13th, Cairine Wilson students, staff and members of the Orleans and Navan Community joined together for Cairine Wilson's 8th Relay for Life. The Opening Ceremony began with Connor Simmons, a grade 9 CW student, piping the Honored Survivors to the stage at the Navan Fairgrounds. Followed by motivating speeches from Survivors and beautiful songs by students and Ms Paddon.

The Survivors were piped by Connor around the Navan track for the official first lap. The students, staff and the community all cheered the Survivors on and then joined in. The sunny day was filled with many games, activities and of course people walking the track for the next 12 hours. A delicious supper for 300 students, staff, family and friends was enjoyed, thanks to Hal McPherson, the Lion's Club and parent volunteers.

At sunset, the CW Relay Committee lit the luminary bags that displayed heartfelt messages to loved ones and the HOPE sign while more Survivors and students told their stories as to why they Relay for Life. The activities continued through the evening despite the downpour of rain that began at 10pm. The Closing Ceremony announced the amount raised by the CW students. The total raised this year was \$46,619, for an 8 year total of \$263,369. Many thanks to Margaret McNeil for her support and help, CTAS for their ongoing support, ML Bradley Bus lines for providing the CW staff and students with free busing to the event. 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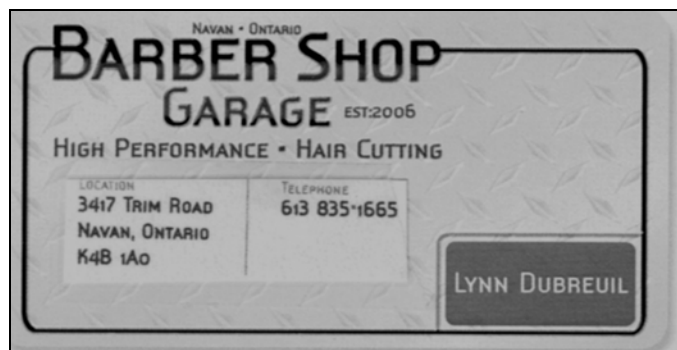
In June we had a brief visit from residents of Navan Ireland, who were on a motorbike tour of Ontario.

The new format for the Navan Fair Bed Race will be more exciting this year.

RULES

- 1) Form a team of six members – four to push the bed, one “Jockey” (to be in the bed) and a spare ... just in case.
- 2) All team members must be in costume.
- 3) Race will a timed event leaving the Fire Station on Colonial – racing to the corner of Colonial and Trim – swapping of costumes is a must with either a team member or another team’s member (you will be watched) and then race back to the Fire Station.

- 4) 3 teams will race at a time until all teams have raced – then winners of each group will race the other winners until a champion team is found.
- 5) Fill in the waiver form.

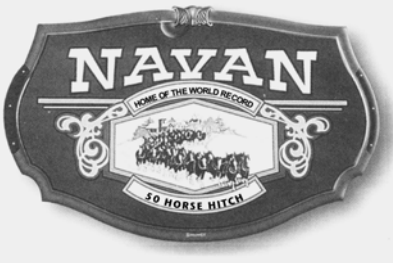

HOME TIP OF THE MONTH

Fresh Preserving Tips and Tricks

What you need to know for preserving fruits and vegetables

- Use only the best, top-quality ingredients. Preserve fruits and vegetables at their peak of freshness.
- Leave the recommended headspace when filling jars.
- Remove air bubbles by sliding a nonmetallic spatula between the jar and food; press gently on the food to release trapped air. Repeat 2 to 3 times around the circumference of the jar.
- Wipe rim and threads at the top of the jar with a clean, damp cloth before putting the lid on the jar to remove any residue and ensure full contact between the sealing compound and jar rim. Center heated lid on jar. Apply band and adjust until fit is fingertip tight.
- After heating, or processing, remove jars from canner; set jars upright on a towel to cool. Allow jars to cool undisturbed for 12 to 24 hours. Bands should not be retightened as this may interfere with the sealing process.
- After 24 hours and before storing, check lids for seals. Lids should not flex up and down when center is pressed. Remove bands. Try to lift lids off with your fingertips. If the lid cannot be lifted off, the lid has a good seal. If a lid does not seal within 24 hours, immediately reprocess or refrigerate.
- Label and store jars in a cool, dry, dark place. For best quality, use fresh preserved foods within one year.
- Dress up your jar with cloth, ribbon, and decorative labels. Get creative and share with friends!

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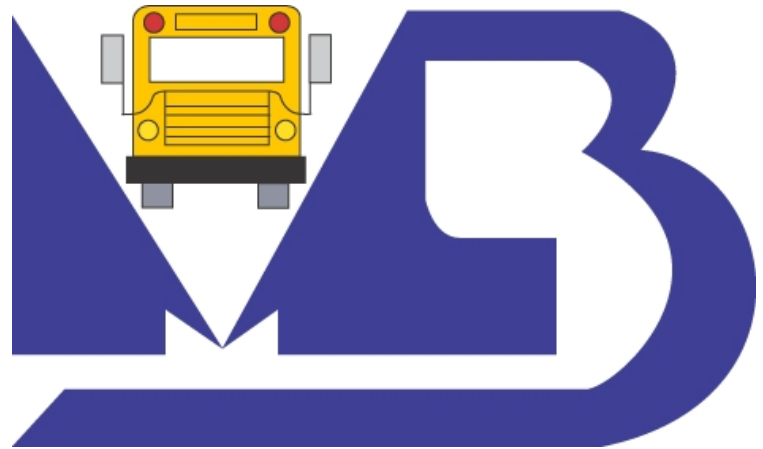
