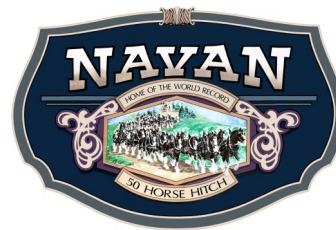

The Maple Leaf meets the Shamrock in Navan, Ont.

With months of planning and fundraising behind them on both sides of the Atlantic, with their bags packed the Navan2Navan crew of 37 volunteers arrived at Dublin Airport on Wednesday 8th August. This crew was joined in Canada by one more volunteer the following day.

A trans Atlantic flight lay ahead of them to Toronto Canada followed by a short flight to the City of Ottawa. The resting place of Michael O'Meara, the man who named his new home town in the new world after Navan, County Meath .

There destination was the country village of Navan Ontario now a suburb of the City of Ottawa and the home of the Navan Fair. They would attend this event as invited guests of the Navan Fair Board of Directors. Their arrival in Ottawa airport saw the end of a three month drought for this Canadian region as in typical Irish style the heavens opened with rain to greet them much to the delight of local farmers.

A big yellow school bus provided by the Navan2Navan-Canadian Committee transferred the visitors to their accommodation either to the Chimo Hotel or billets in Navan. The visitors staying in Navan began with an impromptu Bar-b-que with the billet families which went on until the early hours of the morning.

Early Thursday morning came around too quick and with the bags stowed away and with little sleep, morning saw the yellow bus once again on duty on the streets of Ottawa and Navan Ontario to take the Navan2Navan crew on a tour in the footsteps of Michael O'Meara through the village of Navan, Ontario and surrounding area .The tour included a visit to the O'Meara homestead now the home of the Rathwell family the site of the original Navan Post office. The day was spent visiting many high Tec farms in large parts run by robots where the animals are permanently housed but it also included a walking tour of the village of Navan. A trip to the famous McWilliams homestead the third generation family with Irish roots who were the driving force behind the 50 horse hitch pulling a wagon which is the largest horse hitch ever recorded. 50 Clydesdales horses pulling one wagon through the streets of Navan, Ontario has put Navan in the Guinness book of records and has gives Navan, Ontario its emblem of a wagon pulled by work horses. To the delight and surprise of

the Navan2Navan group this tour included a meal provided by the two local church communities the Anglican and United churches in the local community centre and finished up with a trip to a local vine yard where free samples were not in short supply. What was memorable and noticeable about this tour was the friendless and the openness of the many who facilitated this event and how prominent the tricolour was on displayed in many public places and at homesteads we visited. Also how engaging and willing were the local Navan residents as with great pride they told the group of their Irish heritage.

At 7 pm we participated in the opening ceremonies of the Navan Fair 2012. In a week of high emotion and of great surprises the group with other invited guests including the Mayor of Ottawa, Jim Watson, Councillor Stephen Blais and representatives of the Irish Embassy in Ottawa just to name a few, this select group were applauded into a large gathering of invited guests assembled to launch the Navan Fair and were given VIP seating. As part of this great ceremony the Navan2Navan group were presented with a framed scroll to bring back to Navan Ireland as a sign of friendship between the two communities. This event concluded with the Navan2Navan crew musicians entertaining the assembled guest with a host of gigs and reels. After retiring to the Navan Curling Club lounge where merriment and song continued into the early hours.

Friday morning early, the Irish team opened up the Tourism Ireland Boyne Valley Trade stand at the Fair and it was manned for the weekend by volunteers from the Navan2Navan group. During that day Friday and on other days a large amount of media appearances were carried out by members of the Navan2Navan group on both national and local radio and television (Ireland and Canada) with their message the Boyne Valley region of Ireland is opened for business This trade stand was manned from the hours of 9 am until 9 pm on the three days of the Fair and as a result thousands of Canadians citizens were greeted with an Irish handshake and a Cead Mile Fáilite and according to Fair organisers this stand was one of the busiest stands at the Fair.

Saturday saw the Navan2Navan group as guest of honour in the annual tradition fair street parade through the streets of Navan Ontario as a large hay wagon with hay bales as seating was used as a float to transport the group now dressed in white t-shirts and red slacks and green Navan2Navan baseball hats with their Navan2Navan emblems on full display. The weather stayed fine for this event and streets including the Trim Road and Fairgreen were full of onlookers again with the tricolour in great prominence throughout the village.

That afternoon saw the Navan2Navan group as guests of honour at a bar-b-que hosted by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Pipe Band at the home of a Sunnyside family, where bagpipes met fiddles and banjos for an afternoon of song and dance only interrupted by rain any Irish man would be proud of. The good news is that the Royal Canadian Mounted Police pipe bands of which there are three in number are now in talks with the Navan2Navan group for a return visit to Navan Ireland as part of the Great Gathering Celebration in Ireland 2013.

On the grounds of the local Navan school the local GAA club the Ottawa Gaels almost met their match that afternoon as the Navan2Navan group challenged the unisex Gaelic football team for a match much to the amusement of local, who gathered to watch this spectacle.

The evening concluded with rehearsals for the show piece of the trip the Navan2Navan 2 hours show to be performed the following day Sunday on the main stage of the Fair ground.

Sunday morning saw the group assembled in the local St Mary's Anglican church for a multi-dominical religious service where hymns including St Patrick's Brest Plate were sang by members of the Navan2Navan group and again to the great surprise of the group a beautiful carved crucifix of maple was presented to the group to be presented to the St. Mary's Parish Navan, County Meath on our return to Ireland. Four members of the group were also interviewed live on the Radio.

As show time approached that afternoon after again being fed thanks to the Navan Fair the nerves began to jangle as the Navan2Navan group realised over 1000 people had assembled in the Fairground to watch their amateur production. The assembled crowd were treated to Irish music song dance and poetry and some more contemporary pieces of music and song. The show was introduced in three languages English, French and Gaeilge and included the re-enactment of the story of Finn McCool and finished with a group rendition of the parting glass which received a standing ovation from all assembled there. To the great surprise of the group all the local news print media the following day carried pictures and accounts of the show showing the Navan2Navan group in a very positive light as ambassadors of Irish heritage and culture. That concluded our official involvement in the Navan Fair 2012. Later that evening the Navan2Navan group were treated to a bar-b-que at the home of local Irish business man Pat Kelly and his family a native of County Galway before retiring for the night in the early hours for some much needed rest

Monday morning again saw the Navan2Navan crew

again assembled early in the big yellow bus for a three hour bus journey to a region in Ontario called the Gaeltach the only official recognised Irish Gaeltach outside the Island of Ireland (Tamworth near Napanee, Ontario)- Stephen and Aralt Mac Giolla Chainnigh. To the great surprise the Navan2Navan group they were greeted onto a big field by Canadians who spoke perfect Donegal Irish and after joining the many assembled Gaeilge speakers for food and drink the Navan2Navan entrained them with both song and dance as Gaeilge before returning to the yellow bus for the return trip to Ottawa.

With only minutes to spare for our 6 pm invitation the Navan2Navan group arrived at the Irish Embassy in Ottawa for a meet and greet session with Deputy Head of Mission Hilary Reilly, Jayne Shackelford of Tourism Ireland, local tour operators and business people based in the Ottawa area who had assembled there at the request of the Irish Ambassador to Canada Ray Bassett to hear that Ireland and especially the Boyne Valley Region is very much opened for the tour business and has a great amount of investments opportunities available on the banks of the Boyne. As a result of this meet and greet session one Ottawa tour operator has agreed to send their next tour to Ireland as early as next week to Navan, County Meath to sample our cuisine and to sample what the Boyne Valley Region has to offer in the way of history and tourism attractions. Many more have promised to follow this lead. The group then retired to the Heart and Crown, the public house premises -one of the partners is Pat Kelly our new business friend from County Galway to join up with local musicians. On Tuesday morning we were treated to an exceptionally fine tour of Ottawa by tour guide Louie Comerton. A memorable spot was the stunning Notre Dame Basilica built by the Irish community in the Ottawa region where a wreath supplied by the Navan Fair Board was placed by the group in memory of the many Irish who gave their lives to help make Canada the country it is today.

Tuesday was also the day the group then, broke up with some beginning their long journey home to Ireland while others transferred by bus to Albany the capital of New York state on a trip to New York City before returning home over the coming days.

The Navan2Navan group would like to thank all those who made this trip possible for us from the hours of meeting and the organising of the tour itself. To the great credit of the local Navan Ontario residents Navan Ontario became a second home to many of us who had the good fortune to travel there and we can not wait to return. It was for all the trip of a life time and has brought about life changing

experiences for many involved. A big thank you to our many sponsors and supporters here in Ireland and in Canada far too many to mention in just one piece. A big thank you to the residents of Navan, Ontario, the Navan Fair Board and the Navan2Navan-Canadian committee for putting us up in your home and feeding us and for just putting up with us in their wonderful community. We know, we will never be able to return your hospitality and your generosity of spirit but be assured you are welcome in Ireland any time you choose to come. In a life time made up of memories when that judgement day comes I with hand on heart will never be able to say I visited a finer place or had the pleasure of the company of a finer community than that of the Irish community of Ottawa, Canada and especially that community of Navan, Ontario. We, as communities, are now joined in a bond of fellowship and friendship and may this never change. My last thanks I am keeping for Betty, Dave and Margaret, your trip to Navan, Ireland in 2011 made this trip possible and Margaret, it was you and your commitment alone to this trip and your attention to details that made this trip what it was, unforgettable. Margaret, dear friend, thank you and may God hold you in the palm of his hand. See you all soon with the help of God.

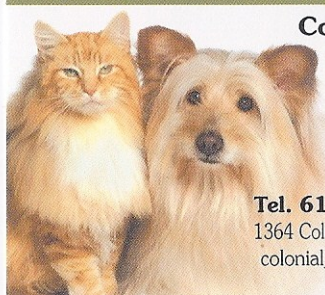

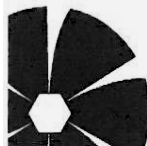

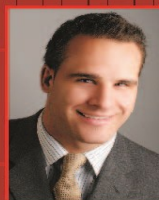
