LINDA DUNN

This month the Nugget introduces Linda Dunn, a dedicated woman living on the edge of Navan, for 39 years. She came from Western Canada as a young bride. In this time, she has done much for our community. She began as a Sunday School and youth group leader in Bearbrook, a Brownie & Girl Guide leader in Bearbrook and Carlsbad and the co-founder of the Navan Nursery School (which stayed in existence for 34 years). She also enjoyed working at the Cumberland Museum as a volunteer and a member of the Cumberland Township Historical Society. She did this while raising her two sons, Andy and Chris. She also served on the Navan Fair Board for almost 20 years, as Education, Food Booth and Entertainment Directors. Other Navan Fair activities were working in the accounting room, acting as MC at official openings, annual meetings, and being the coordinator of Children's Activities for the past two years. Vintage Stock Theatre, where she did many years of amateur acting, was a fun thing to do. She also served on their board of directors for a number of years. This busy lady then took on being the editor and publisher of the Township of Cumberland Communique (a bilingual monthly newspaper dedicated to the people and activities of Cumberland Township). This in turn led her to seek office as Councillor at Large for the Township, a position she held for almost 6 years and which provided her with a whole range of experiences, local, national, and international. Her proudest achievement during



those years was the establishment of the blue box program. Linda returned to University to receive her Master's degree in Public Administration, which led to jobs in the Federal Government. She was very pleased to obtain a U.S. Environmental Protection Agency award for her work on methyl bromide and on the UN Technical Options Committee for alternatives to methyl bromide. After retirement she travelled extensively with her husband. Then the magical time for many Seniors. They are blessed with grand children! Linda and John have 6 little ones to play with now! Wanting to get back to volunteer work she became a member of the Navan Women's Institute where she took on a variety of positions. The Navan Streetwalkers are pleased to have her in this group too. In the not too distant future, Linda will be honoured by the City with the naming of a park after her! Congratulations Linda. We are certainly proud of all your achievements and your good works in our village!! Thank you for your efforts and dedication to Navan!!! And thanks to your generous and loving husband, John, who stood proudly behind you! As the old song says, "It takes two to Tango" and you two have done just that !!

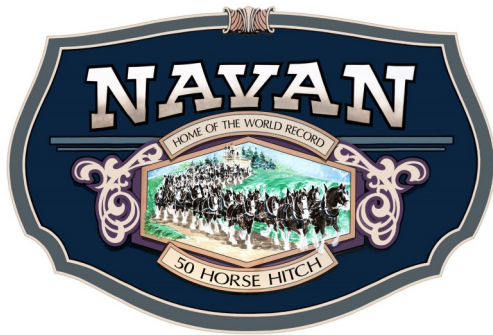

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HIGHWAY 417 EXPANSION PROJECT

This project is beginning this summer to widen Highway 417 by one lane in each direction from Nicholas to the split. This work is in addition to fixing the split itself to enhance traffic flows. The project is expected to be completed in the fall of 2015. From 2015-2018, the additional lanes will be used exclusively as a Transitway detour while the eastern portion of the Transitway is being converted to light rail.

East end commuters will be impacted starting this week by the initial works which require a lane reduction on Ottawa Road 174 westbound from the Blair on-ramp to the split. This lane reduction will be in effect until the end of August 2013. Lane reductions on Highway 417 between Nicholas and the split will begin in June and conclude in the fall of 2015.

To ease disruptions for commuters and motorists, OC Transpo has increased bus service from the Trim Park & Ride Transitway station to downtown. There will be 11 additional transit trips added from Trim to downtown during the morning peak periods and 12 additional transit trips added to the afternoon peak periods from downtown to Trim.

The City will also be providing constant and accurate transit and traffic information at Ottawa.ca, on Twitter, and through the media to help commuters stay informed and make smart travel choices.

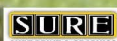
Fire Fighter Day

Bring a picnic or support the Fire Fighter BBQ on site. There are competitions for the children, and an education for the adults.

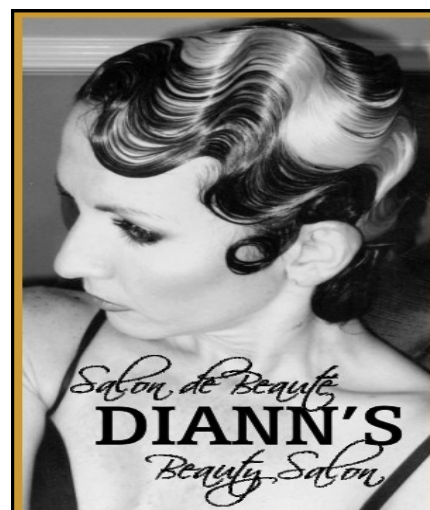

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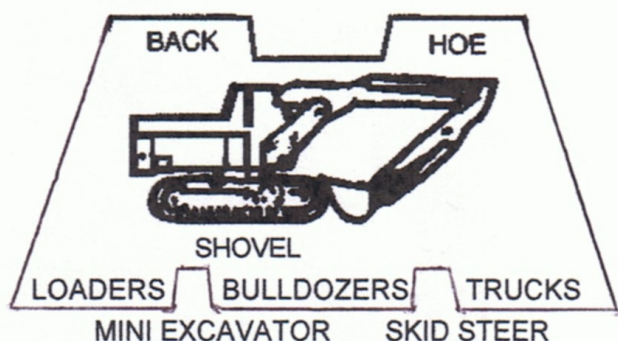
