The Cumberland Township Agricultural Society would like to advise you in advance of planned street closures during some of the 2014 Navan Fair activities.

On Saturday, August 9th the traditional Fair Parade will take place. Participants will congregate in the field off Smith Road just south of Meteor Street. The Parade commences approximately at 10:45 am which will proceed along Smith Road east to Colonial, crossing over Trim and continuing east on Colonial until Delson. The Police and volunteers will be directing motorists and spectators as the Parade proceeds along its route.

Restricted parking signs will be posted on Fairgreen and Delson for emergency access to the Fair grounds and livestock trailers specifically on Delson.

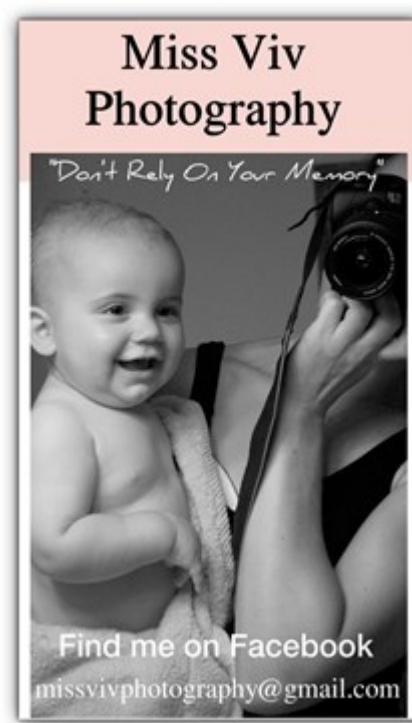

NAVAN FAIR PARADE

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Judging will be based in 3 categories on the following 4 criteria; Creativity/Originality, Decoration & Costume, Crowd appeal, Interpretation of Fair theme, by a panel located along the route.

The 3 categories are; Family, Community, and Commercial.

Floats must be on site no later than 10:00am to be signed in and given their parade position number card for display on the entry. All entries must be pre-registered to participate. (Late-comers, and non-registrants may still join the parade, but risk not being eligible for judging.)

At our insurance company's insistence, livestock exhibitors must provide proof of liability insurance or entries will have to be refused.

(Please Fax to Fair office at 613-835-4008)

Unlicensed drivers will not be allowed to operate motorized vehicles in the parade.

Entries by e-mail to ehodges@xplornet.com, by phone to Eleanor Hodges at 613-833-2792, or fair office at 613-835-2766 by Friday August 1st, 2014. The parade will begin in the field on Smith Road adjacent to Smith Ridge Meadows. (Same as last year)

- Theme of the Fair this year is, "COUNTRY FAIR WITH AN URBAN FLAIR". You may refer to the theme when you design your float entries, but it is not compulsory.
- Each entry is to supply own power (tractor, horse or vehicle) and wagon for the float, with a maximum height of 12 feet.
- *(Please note that costumed children, and decorated bikes & pets, need to be present no later than 10:00 for their judging which will still take place on site so they can receive their prizes that day.)*
- The parade will start at 10:45, rain or shine. The parade ends at the Delson Drive entrance to the Fair grounds. (Floats may continue along Delson to Trim Road for return to the parade field for dismantling if required.)

A school bus is provided to return personnel to the field if needed. Tossing of candy etc; is not recommended due to liability issues, but hand-delivery is encouraged.

PRIZE MONEY 1st - \$75.00, 2nd - \$50.00, 3rd - \$40.00

All prize winners will be posted at the Fair Office no later than 2p.m. after the parade ends. Each prize winning entry will be notified by phone, and advised they can pick up their prize monies and ribbons at the

Fair Office any time during the Fair, or the week following. (Please call ahead to make arrangements.)

Note: Any monies not picked up by the end of September will be considered a donation to the Fair.

The Lloyd G. Morrison Memorial Plaque will be awarded to the "best over-all float" each year. This plaque, donated by Jean Morrison, will be presented at the Annual General Meeting held each January, and then displayed in the Navan Fair Agricultural building. A large rosette ribbon and certificate will also be given to the winning entry to keep.

Children's costumes. - \$6.00 and a ribbon will be awarded to each worthy entry. *(Entrant must participate in the Fair Parade, but NOT as part of a float.)*

Decorated bikes and wagons, 3 -12 years of age. - \$4.00 and a ribbon to each worthy entry.

Decorated pets, 3 -12 years of age. Must be on a leash, or in a cage and on a wagon if required. - \$4.00 and a ribbon to each worthy entry.

Horse & rider. *Ribbons only.*

Horse drawn vehicles. *Ribbons only. (Please display your name on entry.)*

Antique tractor, and /or farm implement. *Ribbons only.*

Antique tractor, and /or farm implement. *Ribbons only.*

Antique cars, trucks, or other antique vehicles. *Ribbons only.*

Decorated Lawn Tractors. (Use your imagination and make your tractor look like something else)
Driver must be 16 years of age. *Ribbons only.*

With the prospect of the Navan Fair coming soon, The Navan Lions Club has been very active. 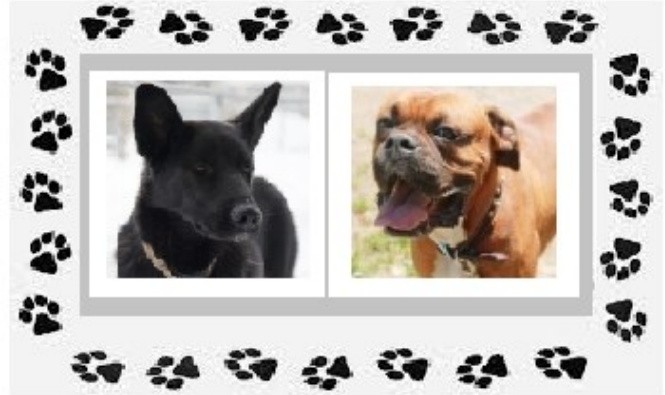

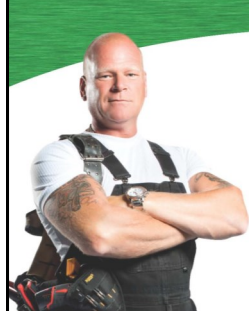

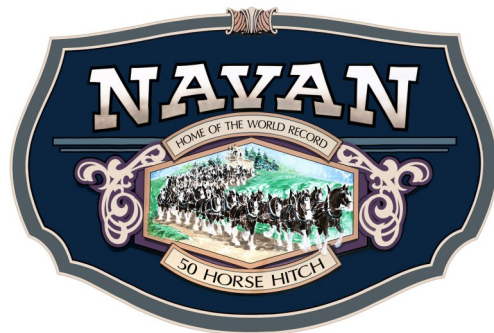

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NAVAN COMMUNITY BUILDERS WALL

On June 7th, 2014, the Navan Community Association held their 3rd annual Community Builders Ceremony. This event commemorates people, families or groups that have greatly contributed to the village of Navan. This year, four new names were added to the wall.



Michael O'Meara is one of them. This man was born in the Parish of Navan, Ireland in 1799. He immigrated to Canada with his family and settled in the Cumberland Township where he became postmaster. When asked to give the post office a name, he chose Navan, as a reminder of his own parish. Thus, by naming this village Navan back in the 1860's, he made an impact on everyone who calls Navan home. His daughter married into the Kenny family and his descendants continue to live and contribute to the area. Many of this family were present to accept the plaque in his name. One of the highlights of this presentation was a guest, Paddy, who brought greetings from Navan Ireland.



Erin Zintel presented the biography of her family, the Smiths. There have been 7 generations of Smiths that have lived in Navan for over 150 years. During all this time, many have helped build and shape this community as well as helped to protect this country. In 1856, Thomas Smith bought land in Navan that became the Smith homestead from one generation to the next. This farm is one of the few Century farms in the district. Through all those years and to this present day, the Smith family have contributed to build Navan by participating on various committees, by being active members in the local church and belonging to various community-minded associations or clubs such as the Lions and the Navan Women Institute. Eric Smith, a decorated veteran and recipient of many honours for his distinguished military career accepted the plaque on behalf of the Smith Family.



Another Community Builder that was honoured is James Wesley Savage. This pioneer was born on the family farm in Navan in 1888. He was a person with a strong volunteering tradition. He gave of his time, knowledge, skill and money. To name a few of his contributions, he was involved in his church and was an active member of local clubs. He was a promoter for the first Boy Scout pack in Navan, the Junior Farmers, and Girls Homemakers Club. Wes Savage was a key member in helping to build the Navan arena and served a term as president of the Cumberland Township Agricultural Fair. Wes and his wife worked hard to make Navan a great place to be. Barbara Alexander gratefully accepted the plaque on behalf of her father.



Sheila Minogue-Calver was also recognized as a Community Builder. She chose Navan as her home and has been a community asset ever since. She is a person who truly makes a difference in her community by being an organiser, a volunteer and mostly a visionary. Sheila spear-headed the Town Clock Plaza for Navan's 150th anniversary. She was a key-player in the Beautification of Navan in 2001 when Navan hosted the International Plowing Match. She was instrumental in the two horse statue at the CTAS office. Sheila is a founding member of the Navan Curling Club and has helped with fundraising. She is a very active member of Navan Women's Institute and has formed groups such as the Knotty Knitters, the Navan Knights and other groups wherever she finds there is a need. Sheila is a very worthy recipient of the Community Builders plaque. She was very pleased to accept the honour and was ready with her list of next things to do for Navan.

ROBINS AND THRASHERS

I was going to write about robins because they are such beautiful yet ubiquitous birds and I felt strongly that just because they are so common they should not be ignored. However, as a person from the UK robins here are pseudo robins – “real” robins to me are the European species. Also known in Britain as the gardener’s friend because of its friendliness in the way it investigates freshly turned over earth for worms, grubs and other insects almost ignoring any humans in the vicinity. The two species occupy similar spots in the eco system. English robins (*Erithacus rubecula*) are not related to American robins (*Turdus migratorius*) – yet they both sing sweetly and are to be seen on lawns flaunting their red breasts and tugging up worms. American robins like their European counterparts are also authoritative – they are assertive about your lawn – it’s their territory – not yours. But American robins are in fact Thrushes and have a breeding range which encompasses all of North America – and they are known to go visiting in Europe – the last American robin to be sighted in the UK was in 2007. And what about the other direction? There have been a few attempts to introduce European robins into North America but all have failed, fortunately. They both have similar diets, for example the American robin’s diet generally consists of around 40 percent invertebrates, such as earthworms, beetle grubs, caterpillars and grasshoppers, and 60 percent wild and cultivated fruits and berries. Both have beautiful song – but to me the clear winner in song is the American robin which has a truly lovely voice. People have continued to report birds that they have seen. Ross Bradley was excited about the fact that he had been regularly visited by



a pair of Brown Thrashers – elusive yet beautiful birds. The adult bird is a large, slender-bodied song bird with a long tail; it looks a lot like a thrush. It has an interesting, beautiful yet complex song. It is thought to have been named “Thrasher” because of thrashing sounds it makes into certain circumstances. So do keep an eye out for Brown Thrashers.
