The Jerry Calver Memorial Curling Bonspiel once again attracted a full complement of teams. The event was considered a roaring success! It was the 23rd year that the Club organized a curling bonspiel. It was named after Dr. Jerry Calver in 2013 following his premature death from pulmonary fibrosis. It was the second occasion that Lions Brian Moore and Luc Picknell were the key organizers.

The event raised just over \$10,000 for Navan Lions funding projects and in particular allowed a donation to be made to the Canadian Pulmonary Fibrosis Foundation (CPFF). The CPFF improves the lives of Canadians living with pulmonary fibrosis by providing compassionate support, leading advocacy, raising awareness, funding research, and inspiring hope.

A small contingent of participants this year had never had the opportunity to meet Dr. Jerry Calver or knew much about him. Placemats on each table provided everyone with some information while the emcee during Saturday's dinner, Lion Tony Fiorentino, President of the Navan Lions Club, dedicated time before and after dinner to inform everyone about some of Jerry's accomplishments including serving more than 30 years at Health Canada, becoming an expert on bacterial vaccines and publishing a book on the subject of biologics, which he dedicated to his wife Sheila for her patience and encouragement. Jerry not only served as the President of the Navan Curling Club in 1990-91, the year the club moved into new facilities, but was also the President of the Navan Lions Club on three separate seasons. He was inducted to the Navan Builder's Wall in 2012.

The bonspiel serves as an important fundraiser for the Navan Lions Club, enabling us to support many organizations including the CPFF. The event is also an opportunity to reflect on the life lived by a former member of the Navan Lions Club, who was loved by many in the community.

For the humans of ages past, the starry sky was a source of awe and fascination.

Unfortunately, in 2026 pollution denies most of us a good view of the stars. After the sun goes down, there are many wonders to be seen and enjoyed above us. If you know where to look, a simple pair of binoculars can show you star clusters, a giant gas cloud in space, and even a nearby galaxy. The aurora borealis may entertain us with shimmering patterns of ghostly light. Eclipses of the Sun and Moon can be predicted with stunning accuracy, allowing us to weather as the earth's shadow falls onto the Moon, or as the Moon's shadow traverses a narrow path across the surface of the Earth.

Howard Simkover was a Producer-Lecturer with the Montreal Planetarium.

He has spoken about astronomy at Canada's National Museum of Science and Technology, and to groups in Canada and via Zoom the world over. Join us for his highly visual presentation, where he will offer some perspectives on the importance of preserving the night sky as a resource for humanity, and how we can experience the wonders of the sky using only our eyes, or with simple equipment.

A NOTE FROM COUNCILLOR CATHERINE KITTS

As we bid farewell to 2025, I find myself reflecting on just how special Navan is. A heartfelt thank you to the Navan Community Association, Navan Lions, Navan Women's Institute, Station 71, and so many others who give their time year-round. From Music in the Park, Fall Fest, Remembrance Day, the Original Navan Market, Bradley Cup, and the 78th annual Navan Fair, these traditions are the heartbeat of our community.

This year, I had the honour of joining Mayor Sutcliffe for the 2025 Order of Ottawa ceremony. The Order recognizes residents whose leadership and service make Ottawa better for all. I was especially proud to celebrate a new inductee, lifelong Navan resident Wyatt McWilliams. Despite being legally blind, Wyatt continues to operate his full-time family farm raising horses, cattle, and hay. His legacy includes organizing the record-setting 50 Horse Hitch for the Navan Fair's 50th anniversary and leading the Food Aid program that has provided over one million pounds of beef to the Ottawa Food Bank.

I was also privileged to present Ray Vetter with the 2025 Ontario Senior of the Year Award. I proudly nominated Ray and worked with the Mayor's Office to make this

recognition possible. Ray's contributions through Friends of the Mer Bleue, the Navan Community Association, and as co-leader of the Nifty-50+ Seniors Club with his wife Juanita have touched countless lives. It was a joy to surprise him with the award at their December Nifty Fifty luncheon alongside Mayor Sutcliffe.

Budget 2026 was approved in mid-December, and while I was initially vocal about my disappointment with the level of investment for Orléans South-Navan, I rolled up my sleeves and went to work. Through negotiations, key intersection upgrades are happening, road rehabilitation is taking place on Trim, Watson and Navan Rd, a new district park is being built next to the François Dupuis Recreation Centre, the Millennium Park gravel lot is being paved, and critical culvert work is getting done to tee us up for future resurfacing. I also passed a motion to track road maintenance costs per local road so future budgets are guided by hard data.

Public safety also saw major investment. I continue to support Chief Stubbs' Revitalized District Model and regularly raise residents' concerns around rural speeding, theft, and visible policing.

Thank you, Navan, for making 2025 unforgettable. I look forward to making 2026 even better!

We welcome a new column, Cabinet Makers Corner to the 2026 Nugget!

I'd like to introduce myself. I'm Dan St. Pierre. I run a cabinetry/woodworking business Crafting Visions, here in Navan. I will be writing a column for the next year about some cabinetry/woodworking related tips and interesting facts that people may not be aware of. Follow along and learn something new and interesting in the process.

CABINET MAKERS CORNER

Modern Materials For Cabinetry.

A lot of people have heard the terms MDF, Particle Board, Plywood, Veneer, or Melamine, but may not be aware of exactly what these materials are and how or why they are used. MDF, particleboard and plywood are the 3 materials that make up the core or the center portion of most modern sheets/boards used in cabinetry and woodworking these days.

- **MDF** is short for Medium Density Fiberboard. It is a mix of wood fibers, wax, and resin pressed at high pressure into a uniform sheet. It is very stable, routers and sands well and takes paint very well. It's used for trim, doors and other details in painted projects. It is also a core material for many sheet goods
- Much like MDF, **Particle Board** is made with wood chips, saw dust and resin and compressed into a flat board. It is lighter than MDF and makes an ideal flat/stable surface for glueing veneer and other prints to it.
- **Plywood** is made of layers of solid wood glued together under high pressure to form a board. It can be used as a core material or for construction purposes. It is very strong, flexible, cheap to produce. Houses used to be wrapped in wood boards, now they use plywood in place of wood boards, saving money and time on the install.

Veneer refers to a thin layer of real wood that is glued to one of these other materials to form a board. Veneers can be stained, finished, or painted just like a solid piece of wood but have the added bonus of being stable, cheaper, and more consistent.

Finally **Melamine** is a coating applied to the core materials that can be printed with texture and colour to achieve a very durable surface. It comes in a solid colour finish or in a wide variety of wood grains and textures. This is commonly used for cabinet interiors and is cheap, durable and easy to work with.

WESTERN MEADOWLARK AND BLACK-BACKED WOODPECKER

I completed my 2025 birding photo year with a few fun sightings. A Western Meadowlark on Dec. 14th in the fields off of Panmure Road in the far west end 1st located by Ian Davidson on Dec. 6th. With the recent rainy day, some of the snow was melted which exposed its food source again. It was having a rough go of it over the last few weeks. One tough bird, hope it gets going to a warmer area before it runs out of food. How the farmer trained it to be a watchbird for the snowmobile trail I'll never figure out.



Another hard to see bird is the Black-backed Woodpecker. I caught up with this male at the Mer Bleue Bog (note the distinct yellow head patch). It is rare in most of its range.



The BBW can be common in coniferous forests affected by fire, flood or windthrow. BBW depend heavily on the larvae of wood-boring bark beetles (eating one in the photo above) that increase in the wake of these natural disturbances.

REMEMBER CHANGES TO DELIVERY OF THE NAVAN NUGGET
